### Report Highlights:

**On April 9, 2002, Mexico announced that the quantity of select coffee based products (HS 2101.11.01, 2101.11.02, 2101.11.99 and 2101.12.01) imported from the United States had exceeded the safeguard quota agreed to under NAFTA. As a result, beginning April 10, 2002, the tariff increased to 20 percent from the in-quota rate of 2 percent. The higher rate will remain in effect through December 31, 2002.**

The Secretariat of Economy (SE) announced on April 9, 2002, in the “*Diario Oficial*” (Federal Register) that imports of the following products have exceeded Mexico’s safeguard quota for 2002 under NAFTA. As of April 10, imports from the United States above the quota for the following products will be subject to a 20 percent ad valorem tariff.
