The Spanish Ministry of Agriculture (MAPA) recently introduced a Web page displaying current and historical citrus prices. The weekly-updated prices may be of interest to U.S. producers and exporters.

MAPA recently debuted its new “Price Observatory” Web page, which, along with other agricultural product prices, tracks citrus prices at local, at wholesale, and at the point of retail-sale. The Web page has current and historical prices, along with graphs showing the price evolution at the respective commercial levels.

MAPA’s price-tracking Web page includes the names in Spanish and the price information in Euros/Kilo on the following citrus fruit. Here below we provide the reader with the names in Spanish, the English translation, and the scientific name, respectively:

Limón: **Lemon** – *Citrus Limonum* (Risso)

Clementina: **Clementine** – *Citrus reticulata*

Naranja: **Orange** – *Citrus sinensis*

The stated objective of the new MAPA price Web page is “to achieve market transparency within the food chain price establishing process using appropriate methodological and analytical tools.”
