Livestock and Products Saudi Arabia Imposes Ban on Imports of Beef and Dairy Products from Denmark

Report Highlights:

Saudi Arabia recently imposed a ban on imports of beef, beef derivatives, and dairy products from Denmark because of the discovery of Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) in Northern Jutland. The ban is relatively insignficant for the Danish beef industry, but is devastating for Denmark's dairy industry. The Danish Embassy in Riyadh is anxious to begin negotiations with the Saudis on this matter, but must wait until government offices re-open in late March following the Haj holidays.

Saudi Arabia Bans Imports of Beef and Dairy Products from Denmark

The Saudi Ministry of Commerce issued a circular to Saudi traders on March 6, 2000 announcing a ban on imports of beef, beef derivatives, and dairy products from Denmark because of the discovery of Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) or "Mad Cow" disease in Northern Jutland, Denmark. The circular directed Saudi traders not to import these products directly or indirectly from Denmark.

While the ban is relatively insignificant to the Danish beef industry, it is devasting to Danish exporters of dairy products. In 1998, Saudi Arabia imported only 28 metric tons (MT) of beef from Denmark. However, Danish exports of dairy products to Saudi Arabia in 1998 totaled 642 million Danish Kroner, representing 53 percent of total Danish agricultural exports to the Kingdom. See table below.

Qatar has followed Saudi Arabia's lead by banning Danish beef, beef derivates, and dairy products. The Gulf countries of Oman, Bahrain, and the United Arab Emirates have imposed a ban only on beef and beef derivatives from Denmark, according to sources.

Because of BSE- related problems, Saudi Arabia continues to maintain a strict ban on imports of beef and beef derivatives from the following countries:

- Denmark (new ban)

The Saudi government has banned additional products from some of the aforementioned countries due to BSE-related problems. Such products include live animals, bull semen, and in some cases dairy products. The Saudis have not banned beef and beef derivatives form Ireland, but continue to ban imports of live animals and bull semen semen from this country.

Earlier this week, the Ministry renewed its ban on most imports of foodstuffs from Belgium, imposed last year because of dioxin-contaminated feed.
