Report Highlights:

Burmese bean and pulse exports in September 2004 decreased by 70 percent from the same period in 2003. Japan, a major buyer for Burmese Butter beans and other pulses, bought only 308 metric tons of Matpe and Bamboo beans. India took 84 percent of the total Burmese bean and pulse exports this month.

Trade

Burma exported 30,748 metric tons (mt) of beans and pulses in September 2004, down 70 percent from the same period of 2003. These exports were also the lowest in 2004. Matpe accounted for 43 percent of total exports, followed by Toor Whole (21 percent), Chickpeas (14 percent), and Mung beans (13 percent), respectively. The major destination was India, accounting for 84 percent of the total bean and pulse exports, followed by Malaysia (5 percent).

Market situations

New bean and pulse crops are still entering the market. Trading activities are weak and most of the trading is done on credit. It should be noted that Burmese bean and pulse exports have dropped for the forth-consecutive month this year. Japan, an active buyer in the past, did not import any Butter beans in September. Most of the European buyers bought only Kidney beans. Bean and pulse exports to China and Thailand are mostly border trade deals.
