Report Highlights:

India took 79 percent and China took 12 percent of the total Burmese beans and pulses exports. Exports to China and Thailand are mostly border trade deals. The Burmese and Thai governments reportedly agreed to cooperate in a joint research on soybean production.

Trade

During August, Burma exported 47,786 metric tons (mt) of beans and pulses. Black Matpe comprised 49 percent, Toor Whole (Pigeon pea) 19 percent, and Mung beans 19 percent of the total bean and pulse exports. The major destination was India who took 79 percent of the total bean and pulse exports. August's exports decreased 45 percent from the previous August in 2003.

23 mt of Kidney beans

Market Situations

New bean and pulse crops are still entering the market. Except for Black Matpe, trading activities for other beans and pulses are weak. The Burmese and Thai governments

reportedly agreed to cooperate in a joint research on soybean production. Under the agreement, Thailand will provide training to Burmese officials and seedlings for field trial in Burma. It is also projected to build a soybean oil refinery plant using advanced technology. A portion of soybean oil production from this plant will be exported to the world market. As usual, India was the largest buyer of the total beans and pulses in August (79 percent), followed by China (12 percent). Bean and pulse exports to China and Thailand are mostly border trade deals.
