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## **Report Highlights:**

Costa Rica's coffee production reached 2,502,598 60- kg bags in 2000/2001. Production for the 2001/2002 period is forecast at 2,560,000 bags, although the Costa Rican Coffee Institute is forecasting a slightly higher crop (2,591,000 bags).

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## COSTA RICA: COFFEE SEMI-ANNUAL REPORT

Costa Rica's 2000/2001 coffee production reached 2,502,598 60 kg. bags or 0.5 percent higher than reported in our annual report. According to the Costa Rican Coffee Institute (ICAFE), production is expected to reach 2,591,000 bags in 2001/2002. Although this forecast is 30,000 bags or 1.2 percent higher than Post's current forecast, the coffee harvest is just beginning. Therefore there are no changes to the production estimate at this time.

Low international prices for coffee are expected to have a negative effect on production in 2002/2003. However, at this time is too early to make a forecast on the effects of the crisis on local production. Some sources have indicated that area planted has been declining and may decline even further in the coming year. ICAFE has conducted an area planted survey but will not release it until December. The financial situation has also spread to coffee processors which typically finance producers with advances on their crop with funds obtained from the banking system. Since many producers have not been able to repay loans, some of the processors in turn have not paid the banks back.

According to industry sources the quality of the 2001/2002 crop that has been harvested so far is very good. Nevertheless, Costa Rica has received substantially less rain this year during the rainy season and that has delayed the crop in some production areas. The lower volume of rain, may have been beneficial to coffee growers in areas that are otherwise affected by fungi and diseases during the rainy season.

According to ICAFE, coffee exports reached 2,257,149 60 kg. bags during the 2000/2001 marketing year. PS&D export numbers therefore were adjusted slightly. On a calendar year basis, revenue from coffee exports declined from \$186.7 million in the first six months of 2000 to \$113.8 million during the first six months of 2001.

Costa Rica is planning to destroy or at least withhold from the market about 5 percent of its lowest quality coffee. Processors have been asked by ICAFE to withhold the worst 5 percent of the crop (damaged, black or broken beans). The plan started in October with the 2001/2002 crop.
