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Post: New Delhi

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Report Highlights:

Post estimates marketing year (MY) 2019/20 cotton production at 29.3 million 480 lb. bales (37.5 million 170-kilogram bales/6.4 MMT) with a planting area of 13 million hectares. The Cotton Advisory Board (CAB) lowered its MY 2019/20 estimates for area and production, which is expected to result in a short-term increase in raw cotton prices that have been trading below the minimum support price (MSP). Limited government procurement, weak export demand, and poor domestic mill purchases are leading the government to consider measures to boost prices to support the farmers.

Cotton area estimates vary among government agencies

On November 28, 2019, the Cotton Advisory Board (CAB) revised MY 2019/20 estimates. Among the most significant changes was the revision of the cotton planted area to 12.584 million hectares. The CAB area estimates are much lower than area estimated by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (MOAFW). Based on the sowing progress reports published by the MOAFW, planted area as on September 26, 2019 has reached 12.763 million hectares. Further official sources confirmed that area had reached 12.854 million hectares as on October 17, 2019. Post has also compiled cotton planted area published by individual cotton growing states which indicates that planted has crossed 13 million hectares. Thus, Post estimates India's marketing year (MY) 2019/20 cotton planted area remain unchanged at 13 million hectares.

Production

Post estimates marketing year (MY) 2019/20 cotton production at 29.3 million 480 lb. bales (37.5 million 170-kilogram bales/6.4 MMT). Post's MY 2019/20 production estimate is 200,000 480 lb. bales lower than the official USDA estimate. According to trade contacts, there are no reports of pink bollworm (PBW) infested cotton arrivals in the market currently. However, there are reports of pink bollworm in Gujarat, Telangana and Maharashtra in the standing crop. In Gujarat, official reports of sucking pest and PBW are from South Saurashtra (districts of Porbandar, Junagarh), which is only three percent of the state cotton acreage. The impact would be visible in the arrivals mostly during the third picking which would arrive in the market yards in one months' time. Similarly, in Maharashtra and Telangana, prevailing weather conditions are congenial for incidence of pink bollworm in cotton as per official reports, so farmers have been advised to monitor for the pest and plan for using pheromone traps and spraying pesticides.

The CAB has revised the MY 2019/20 production estimates to 28.1 million 480 lb. bales (36 million 170- kilogram bales/6.1 MMT). Yields are now estimated at 486 kilograms per hectare, one percent lower than Post's yield estimate of 491 kilograms per hectare.

Post has revised and adopted the MY 2018/19 CAB production estimates at 25.8 million 480 lb. bales (33 million 170-kg bales/5.6 MMT) in line with the official USDA production estimates. However, the CAB estimates for MY 2018/19 and MY 2019/20 are provisional and are subject to change based on new information the board may receive in the future.

Arrivals

On December 14, 2019, the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) reported new crop MY 2019/20 cotton arrivals at 5.8 million 480-lb. bales (7.4 million 170-kilogram bales/1.25 MMT). Cotton arrivals so far represent twenty percent of the total cotton production estimate. The pace of arrivals has picked up in the last few weeks and is marginally slower than last year. As of December 14, CCI has procured 1.2 million 480 lb. bales (1.6 million 170 kg bales/272,000 MT) in MY 2019/20 under the minimum support price operations, with the procurement pace increasing during December. CCI continues to hold almost 700,000 480-lb bales (900,000 170-kg bales) of unsold stock from MY 2018/19.

Consumption

Post estimates MY 2019/20 cotton consumption at 24.6 million 480-lb. bales (31.5 million 170-kilogram bales/5.4 MMT), 100,000 480-lb. bales higher than official USDA estimate. Mills continue to maintain lean cotton inventories. The wholesale seed cotton market prices continue to show a declining trend (average prices are seven percent lower than last year) in major cotton growing states, despite higher minimum support prices. Similarly, ex-gin prices in India also continue to remain low as limited government procurement, weak export demand, and poor domestic mill purchases indicate an overall slowdown in textile demand.

Indian cotton ex-gin prices are 3-4 cents lower than Cotlook-A Index which should make Indian cotton competitive in the international market, however, the bulk of the arrivals in the market have a lower grade and a much higher micronaire value (the higher the micronaire value, the finer the fiber, the easier it is to kink and break during processing, and the easier it is to form knots). The prices are expected to move higher as the quantity of purchases by CCI increases during the remainder of the season.

Trade

Post estimates MY 2019/20 exports at 4 million 480-lb bales (5.1 million 170-kilogram bales/870,000 MT) same as the official USDA estimate. Exports shipments of raw cotton during the first three months (Aug-Oct) of MY 2019/20 are 51 percent lower than same period last year. Similarly, cotton yarn shipments for first three months (Aug-Oct) are 30 percent lower than same time last year. But there are signs of revival as shipments in October were higher by 19 percent than previous month as demand for yarn remains firm and should reflect in terms of higher shipments in the coming months. The export shipments of cotton fabric during the first three months (Aug-Oct) of MY 2019/20 are four percent higher than same time last year, and five percent higher in October than previous month.

Post estimates MY 2019/20 imports at 2 million 480 lb. bales (2.6 million 170-kilogram bales/436,000 MT), 200,000 480 lb. bales lower than USDA's official estimate. After a steady flow of strong imports for the last five months, the pace of imports has started slowing down as new crop arrivals pick up in the market. Imports continue to be led by large volume of shipments from the United States, followed by Brazil and West African countries.
