**Bangladesh Cotton Annual - 1999**

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#### **Report Highlights:**

Current year cotton imports are projected at 145,000 tons, up 12 percent from last year due to continued expansion of the Bangladesh textile industry and lower world cotton prices. The US continues to be the principal supplier, with 30 percent of the business. Next year's imports are forecast to climb 3 percent to 150,000 tons.

#### **Production**

Upland cotton production is forecast to climb 36 percent to 15,000 tons in 1999/00 on a 44 percent increase in harvested area. As always, late monsoon rains and insect infestations will have a lot to say about final results, as they did this year when rains damaged one-third of the area, reducing production to an estimated 11,000 tons.

Upland cotton has had only modest growth since its introduction into Bangladesh in the late seventies. It has not fit in well with the usual cropping pattern, especially competition from wheat, despite intense government support. Most Bangladesh cotton is 1 inch to 1 5/32 inches. Production of the indigenous "Comilla Cotton", a short staple variety, has been declining due to diminishing demand from the traditional handloom and cottage industry sector. There is no transgenic cotton produced in Bangladesh.

Man-made fiber (polyester) production is projected to decline to 1,800 tons in 1998/99. Output has dropped two-thirds in the past two years due to the inability of the industry to compete with nearby Asian producers. Production of cotton yarn is projected at 120,000 tons this year, up 7.5 percent from 1997/98. Production of fabric (1998/99) is projected at 1,050 million meters, 7 percent above the previous year.

### Consumption

This year's raw cotton consumption is estimated at 153,000 tons, up 7.7 percent from 1997/98 due to increased demand from the rapidly-growing private spinning sector and lower world prices.

Consumption of cotton yarn is projected at 480,000 tons, up 2 percent from 1997/98. Of this, about 130,000 tons is for domestic utilization, while 350,000 tons is for use in export-based hosiery, knitwear and fabrics. Total 1998/99 fabric consumption is projected at 3.6 billion meters, comprised of 1.1 billion for local use and 2.5 billion for export-based garments.

Bangladesh has 118 spinning mills (25,000 spindles each), 109 weaving/finishing mills (about 10 million meter/year capacity each) and 104 dyeing/finishing mills (about 10 million meter/year capacity each). Industry sources estimate that the country needs 234 spinning, 344 weaving/finishing and 327 dyeing/finishing mills to meet domestic and export demand for hosiery, knitwear and garments. The industry believes that to be fully competitive after 2005, when textile quota restrictions in Europe and America are eliminated, they have to be able to spin and weave all yarn and fabric domestically. This would require 242 spinning, 500 weaving and finishing and 475 dyeing/finishing mills. No major foreign investment in spinning, weaving, and dyeing and finishing textiles has occurred in Bangladesh. A few nearby countries have set up small ready-made garment, hosiery and knitwear factories.

## **Marketing**

As Bangladesh's textile industry is growing at about 10 percent annually, it has required larger imports of raw cotton. The United States has been the principal source, while the CIS is the major competitor. Most of the larger mills buy from the US despite the fact that the CIS's prices are 5-10 cents per pound lower. This year's imports are projected at 145,000 tons, up 12 percent from last year.

Cotton yarn imports are estimated at 370,000 tons in 1998, with India having a 78 percent share of the market. Imports in the first quarter of 1999 are estimated at 95,000 tons; the projection for all of 1999 is 376,000 tons. China has 80 percent of cotton fabric imports, which are estimated at 2.63 billion meters in 1998. Trade sources believe that Chinese fabric prices are highly subsidized. Imports during the first quarter of 1999 are estimated at 660 million meters; the projection for all of 1999 is 2.65 billion meters.

Smuggling of bonded, duty-free yarn and fabrics (from export-based hosiery, knitwear and garment plants) is continuing, though at a much reduced level. Trade sources report that Indian 30 count yarn is available at US\$ 2.60/kg for carded and US\$ 3.00 for combed compared to US\$2.85/kg for carded and US\$ 3.28 for combed Bangladeshi yarn. Still, there is a 25 percent cash incentive for export-based yarn production in Bangladesh.
