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**Report Highlights:**

This report lists certificates required by Thai government agencies for U.S. products exported to Thailand, including fruit and vegetables, live animals, beef, canned or preserved meat and poultry products, other processed meat products, processed or frozen seafood, hides and skins, distillers dried grains, live animals, and any food that undergoes a production process (i.e., make, mix, prepare and re-packing).

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## **Executive Summary**

This report presents executive summary of U.S. export certification requirements for food and agricultural products to Thailand per requirements of relevant Thai regulatory agencies: Food and Drug Administration, Department of Livestock Development, Thai Customs Department and Thai Excise Department. Key certification requirements include Certificate of Free Sale or GMP Certificate that must be issued by an internationally accredited body and attest to food quality assurance systems like HACCP, ISO, or equivalent. It's important to note that certification requirements can vary based on the specific product and may change over time. Exporters should work closely with their Thai importers and consult with relevant U.S. government agencies to ensure compliance with the most current requirements. The recent change includes copies of export certificates accompanying U.S.-origin imported foods, including fresh fruit and vegetables shipments, into Thailand need to be certified by the issuing agencies or carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace. ## **Section IV. Other Certification/ Accreditation Requirements to Ensure Market Entry**

### **1. Any food that undergoes a production process (i.e., make, mix, prepare and re-packing) or all four categories of food as prescribed by Food Act B.E.2522 (1979)**

- a. Certificate of Free Sale/Certificate of Health and Sanitation/Export Certificate (GMP Certificate)
  - i. The certificate needs for product registration of “Specific Controlled Food” category and product filing of “Standardized Food, Food Required to Bear Label and General Foods” categories.
  - ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for one year and can also be applied to multiply shipments of the identical product.
  - iii. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.
  - iv. Thailand accepts e-certificate, original certificate or copies of export certificates accompanying U.S.-origin imported foods, including fresh fruit and vegetables shipments, into Thailand. However, to be accepted by TFDA, the copies of export certificates have to (i) be certified by the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace.<sup>3</sup>
- b. Certificate of Origin
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

### **2. Beef and Poultry Meat and Products**

- a. Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of wholesomeness Certificate (FSIS Form 9060-5)
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment.
  - iii. The plant number specified must correlate with the letterhead certificate and the USDA Export Verification document.

### **3. Canned or preserved meat and poultry products**

- a. Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of wholesomeness Certificate (FSIS Form 9060-5)
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment.
  - iii. The plant number specified must correlate with the letterhead certificate and the USDA Export Verification document.
- b. Thailand accepts an original U.S. state issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.
- c. Certificate of Origin
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

### **4. Low acid and Acidified foods Packaged in Hermetically Sealed Containers.**

- a. U.S. FDA's On-line Process Filing document
  - i. The certificate is required for product registration.
- b. Thailand accepts a U.S. FDA's On-line Filed Process Filing document when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agency or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or a Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.
- c. Certificate of Origin
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

### **5. Distillers Dried Grain**

- a. Certificate of Origin
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

### **6. Fruit and Vegetable<sup>4</sup>**

- a. Phytosanitary Certificate
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for the indicated shipment. The certificate must be endorsed by the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS). Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.

After the first shipment, shippers or importers are allowed to present a copy of the notarized copy at the time of the shipment clearance as long as the dates indicated in the certificate are valid. The Thai Food and Drug Administration is usually willing to revise its list of approved standards upon an official report of exporting countries.

## 7. Hides and skins

- a. Health Certificate
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate.
  - iii. Thailand accepts an original U.S. state issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>.
  - iv. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.
- b. Certificate of Origin
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.

## 8. Live Animals

- a. Animal Health Certificate
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. The certificate is valid as indicated on that certificate, otherwise valid for the indicated shipment.
  - iii. The certificate must be endorsed by APHIS. Thailand does not accept a Suppliers or Manufacturers Export Declaration as proof of compliance.
  - iv. Thailand does not accept a U.S. State issued export certificate.

## 9. Other Processed Meat Products

- a. Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of wholesomeness Certificate (FSIS Form 9060-5)
  - i. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. The certificate is valid only for the particular shipment.
  - iii. Thailand accepts an original U.S. state issued export certificate or copy of such certificate when the document is officially certified by (i) the issuing agencies or (ii) carry the original seal of a U.S. Notary Public, Chamber of Commerce, Commissioner of Oaths, or Justice of Peace<sup>3</sup>. 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<sup>5</sup> Processed food that contains GM plant, animal, and microorganisms (e.g., canned corn, corn soup, smoked salmon fillet, seasoned fried salmon skin, and yeast extract) that were registered with the Thai FDA and imported or sold in Thailand before December 4, 2022, are exempted from providing additional import documents for Thai FDA inspection at the port of entry. However, such food products must comply with Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified. The Thai FDA will conduct random checks to determine whether events contained in the imported food products match the events listed in the positive and temporary approval lists.

The TFDA may require an analytical report from a recognized laboratory or a government laboratory for Processed food products that have undetectable genetically modified organisms and recombinant proteins due to processing, as the default assumption would be that the food is bioengineered or contains GM food ingredient (e.g., corn oil, sorbitol from corn starch, corn modified starch, salmon oil, salmon collagen, salmon cartilage, yeast extract, oligosaccharides, vitamin B12, steviol, and glycoside) to clarify for inspectors and maintained for documented verification purpose.

  - iii. The COA must be for a specific silo/batch issued by a government laboratory from the country of origin, a government laboratory in Thailand or a private laboratory accredited by the Thai government.
- c. Phytosanitary Certificate
  - i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. GM events listed in the certificate or document must match with Positive List (Annex 1) or the Temporary Approval List (Annex 6) of Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified.
  - iii. The phytosanitary certificate must specify the events/traits or OECD unique identifier of GM plants.
- d. Health Certificate
  - i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. GM events listed in the certificate or document must match with Positive List (Annex 1) or the Temporary Approval List (Annex 6) of Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified.
  - iii. The health certificate must specify the events and/or traits or OECD unique identifier or must specify the absence of any unauthorized GM.
- e. Invoice or Packaging List
  - i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. GM events listed in the certificate or document must match with Positive List (Annex 1) or the Temporary Approval List (Annex 6) of Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified.
  - iii. The invoice or packing list must specify the events or OECD unique identifiers contained if the food is derived from GM organisms.
- f. Self-Verified Documentation
  - i. The original export certificate or document needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
  - ii. GM events listed in the certificate or document must match with Positive List (Annex 1) or the Temporary Approval List (Annex 6) of Ministerial Notification No.431 B.E. 2565 (2022) RE: Foods Derived from the Genetically Modified.
  - iii. The self-verified document issued by the manufacturer or exporter.

## 12. Wine

- a. APEC Model Wine Export Certificate

- i. The original certificate is required to obtain the import permit. The import permit is valid for three years.
- ii. The APEC Model Wine Certificate is a multi-purpose certificate used for Certificates of Authenticity/Free Sale, Certificates of Health/Sanitation, and Certificates of Origin.
- iii. The original certificate needs to accompany the product at the time of entry.
- iv. Thailand accepts an issued export certificate when the document is officially certified by the authorized officer in the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau.

### **13. Beer**

- a. Certificate of Sanitation

### **15. Food Radiation and Attesting to the Radioactivity of Imported Food**

The Thailand government requires attestation of radioactivity to certify the establishment for irradiation processing of the imported irradiated food per requirements set forth in Annex 1 of the [Ministerial Notification Re: Irradiated Food](#) or following standards:

- a. Codex: Recommended International Code of Practice for Radiation processing of Food (CAC/RCP 19-1979, Rev. 2-2003)
- b. American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM)
- c. International Organization for Standardization (ISO)
- d. The exporting country's code of practice for radiation processing of food.

Additional details on food import requirements and procedures, including import permit, product registration, and food labeling are available in the Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards (FAIRS) report at [www.fas.usda.gov](http://www.fas.usda.gov).

In addition, both the DOA and the DLD require import permits. The procedure for import permit issuance has been, at times, non-transparent for certain pork and poultry products. The DLD agreed in principle (although not officially in writing) to accept “system audits” for exporting facilities instead of its earlier requirement of “separate plant audits.” However, the DLD added the requirement that exporting countries of animal and animal products must complete the DLD’s questionnaire for approval before the DLD send its team to conduct on-site inspections for each exporting country.

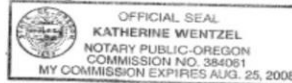

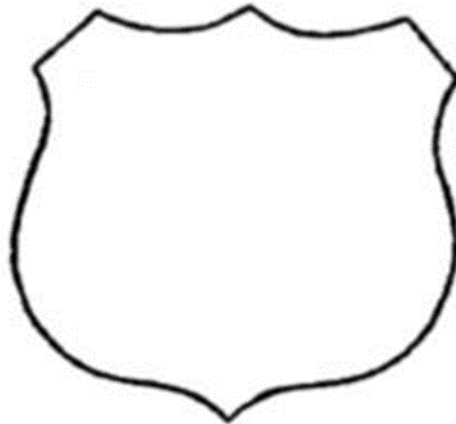
