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**Report Highlights:**

The Egyptian Government no longer requires the authentication of Certificates of Origin from the Egyptian Embassy; however, authentication of animal health certificates is still required. On June 16, 2023, the Government of Egypt (GOE) issued a WTO/TBT addendum extending the requirement for halal certification of imported milk and dairy products until October 1, 2023. In March 2023, Animal and Plant Health Service changed VS-form 16-4 form for animal products exported to Egypt. The revised form will allow for enhanced flexibility moving forward.

## **Executive Summary**

In June 2022, Egypt launched a trial phase of the Advanced Clearance Information (ACI) system on airfreight with an initial implementation date of October 2022; however, the system remains voluntary. A three-month implementation period is expected when the Government announces that the system is mandatory.

On October 1, 2021, Egypt launched the Advanced Clearance Information ACI system with designated platforms for registration—CargoX for exporters (although importers must also apply) and ACI for importers. The Egyptian Embassy's authentication on Certificates of Origin is no longer required, according to the general manager of Misr Technology Services (MTS). Once the shipment documents are uploaded, the system generates a unique ID number (ACID) on the platform that is required on all documents. However, control agencies such as the Central Administration of Plant Quarantine (CAPQ), the National Food Safety Authority (NFSA), and General Organization for Veterinary Service (GOVS) agreed to not include the ACID on the phytosanitary/sanitary and health certificates.

On June 16, 2023, the Government of Egypt (GOE) issued a World Trade Organization (WTO) Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) addendum extending the requirement for halal certification of imported milk and dairy products until October 1, 2023. This is the sixth addendum filed by the GOE to the WTO regarding milk and dairy halal certification since December 2021 (See: [GAIN EG2023-00014 Egypt Notifies Another Postponement of Halal Dairy Certification Requirement Until October 1 2023](#)).

Although the certificates are technically not required per the notification, Post Cairo industry contacts report that importers continue to present the certificates and are not paying any halal certification fees for imported milk and dairy products.

The requirement to certify milk and dairy products was initiated on December 1, 2021, when Egypt published a WTO/TBT notification to notify the expansion of products requiring halal certifications. The products notified included milk and dairy products, along with meat, poultry, and their products. Furthermore, the notification identified a single certifier, "ISEG Halal," which was created under Prime Ministerial Decree No. 35/2020. In March 2023, Animal and Plant Health Service (APHIS) changed VS form 16-4 form for animal products exported to Egypt. The change included the removal of the statement: “*This is to certify that rinderpest, foot-and-mouth disease, classical swine fever, swine vesicular diseases, African swine fever and contagious bovine pleuropneumonia do not exist in the United States of America*”. The revised form will allow for enhanced flexibility moving forward.

## Section II – Purpose of Specific Export Certificates

See Section I, Table 1: List of Export Certificates Required by the Government of Egypt (MATRIX) for clarification of the specific purposes of certifications currently required by Egypt.

## Section III – Special Attestation Required on Export Certificates

**Export Certificate:** The export certificates will vary according to the product. The certificate must indicate that the product is produced under a recognized process, ensuring its freedom from public health hazards. The certificate should also indicate that the product is sold for human consumption in the country of origin without restrictions. Egypt accepts the state certificate of free sale. For more information on the entities that issue a state level certificate of free sale, please visit <https://www.fas.usda.gov/certificate-free-sale-point-contact-list>. If questions arise regarding a certificate or attestation needed, exporters should contact FAS Cairo (Post) or the Egyptian importing firm prior to shipping.

**Certificate of Origin:** The Certificate of Origin is required by the Egypt Customs Authority. The General Organization for Export and Import Control (GOEIC) is no longer responsible for most imports of food and food products. The role of GOIEC in Agriculture products is limited to soybean for crushing, corn for feed use, and private sector wheat imports. The National Food Safety Authority (NFSA) is responsible for imports as of November 15, 2019. (See: [GAIN Report Number:EG-19010 - Egypt, Establishment of the National Food Safety Authority](#))

The Certificate of Origin must indicate the manufacturing location of the product imported. State and/or local authorities, including local chambers of commerce in the same jurisdiction as the manufacturing facility, may issue the document. Should the product be packed/processed in the exporting country (i.e., the United States) but originate in another, the product's certificate of origin must indicate the initial production area information.

**Grain and Oilseeds:** A certificate attesting that aflatoxin testing has been completed must accompany all grain and oilseed shipments. The NFSA mandates aflatoxin levels be less than two parts-per-million (ppm) on any imported grain shipment. Egyptian authorities require that grain shipments be accompanied by paperwork indicating the crop year and/or production date of the imported goods. All grain imports must adhere to the Egyptian standard 1601 (2005). The standard specifies the quality/grading characteristics, as well the permissible tolerances of contaminants.

**Meat and Meat Products, Poultry and Poultry Products:** Exporters of animal products must work closely with their Egyptian importers, as well as to check the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) – [Food Safety and Federal Inspection \(FSIS\) Export Library](#) frequently for the latest updates – these requirements are subject to change and are strictly scrutinized by customs authorities.

In addition to the Certificate of Wholesomeness (FSIS 9060-5) a letterhead certificate must accompany each shipment. For meat and meat products the accompanying letterhead must attest that:

- Foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) and rinderpest have not occurred in the United States during the previous 12-months.
- The product was derived from animals born in the United States and/or from animals legally imported into the United States.
- The United States is recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) as being a negligible bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) risk country.
- The product was not derived from animals that were slaughtered in an official disease eradication program.
- The product does not contain or is not contaminated with specified risk materials as defined by the USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service in U.S. regulations, 9 CFR 310.22(a). (See: <https://www.law.cornell.edu/cfr/text/9/310.22>)

For whole frozen poultry, chicken leg quarters, drumsticks and thighs, a letterhead certificate attesting the following must accompany the shipment:

- The poultry meat is derived from birds that were not under official quarantine for serious epizootic diseases affecting poultry including highly pathogenic notifiable avian influenza (HPNAI), as defined by the World Organization for Animal Health.
- The meat is obtained from poultry found to be free of any clinical signs of systemic infectious or contagious diseases to which the species is susceptible as determined by ante- and post-mortem inspection.
- The poultry meat was handled under hygienic conditions under federal veterinary inspection and has not been treated with and does not contain any preservatives, coloring matter, hormones or other substances harmful to human health.
- The poultry meat is wholesome and fit for human consumption.
- The means of transport, handling, and loading conditions meet the hygienic requirements of the United States.

Specific packaging, labeling, and shipping requirements exist for meat, poultry, and their products (See: [GAIN-EGYPT \(2019-0025\) Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards Country Report – FAIRS Narrative Egypt 2020](#)) and the FSIS Export Library.

**Islamic Slaughter Certification:** On December 1, 2021, Egypt published a WTO/TBT notification for the expansion of products requiring halal certificates. The products notified included milk and dairy products, along with meat, poultry, and their products. Egypt still has not issued any official standard, technical regulation, or requirements on guidance with this new requirement. Accordingly, there is no clear guidance or any decision regarding the labelling of the current or newly added products.

Halal certification is required for export to Egypt. Halal certificates are issued by ISEG Halal, Egypt's sole entity for halal certification, certifying that the shipment of meat beef, mutton, poultry, and their derivatives have been slaughtered according to Islamic rites and *sharia* laws. Certifying statements should note that all adequate precautions were taken to prevent contamination with non-halal products, and accordingly, the product is suitable for consumption by Muslims in any part of the world.

**Hormone-Free Certification, Beef and Dairy Products:** On November 15, 2019, NFSA assumed responsibility for handling food imports. However, NFSA continues to rely on import requirements

issued by other agencies such as the General Organization for Veterinary Services (GOVS). Through a memorandum-of-understanding, GOVS continues to issue import permits, as well as sample and test beef and dairy product imports on the behalf the National Food Safety Authority.

Previously in 2012, GOVS started requiring the submission of hormone-free certificates for beef and dairy products as part of its import permit licensing requirements. However, GOVS did not enforce the submission of hormone-free certificates, opting instead to test product upon arrival for synthetic hormones.

**Fish and Fish Products:** Export certificates accompanying fish and fish products shipped to Egypt must attest to the fishing method, potential level of contamination, as well as dates of fishing, packaging and freezing. Attestations must indicate that the fish and their products were not harvested using explosives. Similarly, the certificates must confirm that the fish were not caught in areas contaminated by radiation, fertilizers, or pesticides. Dates of fishing, packaging and freezing (below -18 degrees centigrade) must be indicated on accompanying documents.

**Pre-Clearance – Advanced Cargo Information (ACI) System:** Egypt’s Ministry of Finance issued Decree 38/2021 on pre-shipment registration - Advanced Caro Information (ACI) - under a new single window system that seeks to modernize and automate customs administration, simplify procedures, and reduce clearance times. The procedure is complementary to the Nafeza platform - applying the single window system. The pre-shipment process generates an ID number that should be added to all documents of the shipment including certificates. However, control agencies such as plant quarantine, veterinary quarantine and food safety authority, agreed not to include the ACID on the phytosanitary/ sanitary and health certificates.

## **Section IV – Government Certificate Legal Entry Requirements**

### **General Requirements**

For U.S. agricultural producers planning to ship their products to Egypt, exporters need to consider the following certificate legal entry requirements:

- Original certificate must accompany shipment at time of entry.
- Certificates are used for only the accompanying shipment since it carries the details of the shipment.
- Modification to any certificate is not permitted once issued and shipped with the accompanying the product.

## Section V – Other Certification/Accreditation Requirements to Ensure Market Entry

**Additives:** On September 2020, the Egyptian Food Safety Authority issued Decision 4 (2020) regarding food additives accepted for use by industry. (See: [EG2020-0060: Report Name: Egypt National Food Safety Authority Issues Food Additive Regulation](#).) The decision replaces Decree 204 (2015) of Ministry of Health regulated food additives. U.S. exporters of food additives should note that pre-registration with Egypt’s Ministry of Health required prior to shipment is no longer valid, as NFSA’s decision replaced this decree. NFSA did not issue import requirements for the import and use of food additives; thus, it is not mandatory to include batch numbers packaging and packing lists for added traceability. However, it is important to maintain complete record-keeping until clear guidelines are published. This would also include documentation accompanying food additives describing products using both their scientific and common names. Exporters of these products are encouraged to work closely with NFSA and local importers.

**Bio-Fortified Foods:** to NFSA’s definition of special dietary foods, bio-fortified foods are now covered by NFSA and **imports of bio-fortified foods will follow the same procedures of special dietary foods.** Exporters of bio-fortified foods should note that these products require pre-registration with NFSA prior to shipment. Exporters of these products should contact local importers to stay updated on the registration process.

**Canned Foods:** U.S. exporters of canned foods are advised to include batch numbers in packing lists and packaging. Egyptian authorities depend on batch numbers for traceability in case of a rejected shipment or in the eventuality of product recalls. Failure to include these numbers will delay customs clearance.



**Planting Seeds:** Prior approval is required from the Ministry of Agriculture’s Central Administration of Seed Certification and Testing (CASC) for the import of seeds for planting. Once an approval is granted, the Central Administration for Plant Quarantine will issue a seed import license. Firms wishing to export seeds for planting will be required to provide an international seed testing certificate or a testing certificate issued from an official inspection station abroad including the variety, the degree of purity and the germination percentage, prior to applying for an import permit from the Ministry of Agriculture.

Upon issuance of an import permit, subsequent shipments must be accompanied by the Egyptian import permit, a U.S. seed testing certificate, and the applicable phytosanitary certificate. Since requirements for import of these products is complex and time-consuming, exporters are urged to work with Egyptian importers and Ministry of Agriculture officials well in advance of shipping.

**Oils – Atypical:** Oils considered non-standard must be accompanied by a certificate of analysis describing their chemical composition. Non-standard oils are not clearly defined, but generally considered by Egypt to be blended or essential oils, not typically shipped for human consumption. U.S. exporters of these products are urged to work with Egyptian importers to ensure compliance with Egypt's customs regulations.


