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Report Highlights:

This report outlines export certificates required to ship food and agricultural products to Guyana. The report includes an Export Certificate Matrix as well as examples of select export certificates. For more information related to Guyana's import requirements for food and agricultural products, please refer to the 2023 FAIRS Country Report for Guyana.

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Executive Summary

The following report provides U.S. suppliers information on required export certificates for U.S. agricultural products exported to Guyana. Names of certificates required for different products, specific attestations required on each certificate, sample certificates, and other relevant information are all included in this report.

Guyana requires export certification for processed foods, plants and plant products, meat and poultry, live animals, select animal products and seafood. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration, the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) and Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS), and the U.S. Department of Commerce’s National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) are the main U.S. federal regulatory agencies issuing the required certificates. Links to webpages of these agencies with detailed information on export certification is provided in Appendix III.

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In addition to the above certificates, for new-to-market processed food and beverage products it is recommended that U.S. suppliers provide a manufacturer’s certificate of analysis as well as a sample label to have their importer in Guyana check with GAFDD for any issues that may exist. It is important to note that while this is a not a requirement, such a voluntary check will help prevent any non-compliance issues at the port of entry.

Section II. Purpose of Specific Export Certificate(s)

- Certificate of Free Sale is required by the GAFDD of the Ministry of Health for food safety purposes.
- Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of Wholesomeness (FSIS Form 9060-5) is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for food safety and animal health purposes.
- AMS Sanitary Certificate for Exports (Dairy Products) is required for milk products by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for food safety and animal health purposes.
- Phytosanitary Certificate (APHIS PPQ Form 577) is required for plant health purposes by the National Plant Protection Organization (NPPO), which is part of the Ministry of Agriculture’s National Agricultural Research and Extension Institute (NAREI).
- Health Certificate (for export of fishery products intended for human consumption) is required by the Veterinary Public Health Department, Ministry of Health for food safety purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Cattle from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Bovine Semen from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Horses from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Small Ruminants (Sheep and/or Goats) from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.

- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Small Ruminants (Sheep and Goat) Embryos for Breeding from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Small Ruminant (Sheep and Goat) Semen for Breeding from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Swine from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Porcine Semen from the United States of America to Guyana is required by the GLDA of the Ministry of Agriculture for animal health purposes.

Section III. Specific Attestations Required on Export Certificate(s)

- Certificate of Free Sale: While no set or specific attestation is required, the certificate should indicate that the product can be freely sold in the country where it was manufactured and that it is safe for human consumption. It is worth noting that as a voluntary option, when requesting a Certificate to a Foreign Government from FDA, U.S. suppliers may request that the language “Certificate of Free Sale” be printed as a sublabel on the document. However, this sublabel is not required as the “Certificate to a Foreign Government” title is acceptable on its own.
- FSIS Form 9060-5, Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of Wholesomeness:

In addition to FSIS Form 9060-5, the following statement must be provided on FSIS Form 9060-5B (Meat, Poultry And Egg Products Export Certificate of Wholesomeness Continuation Sheet):

“Based on the results of a national random sampling program, it can be assumed that the meat and/or poultry products listed are free from harmful levels of hormones and antibiotic residues.”

- AMS Sanitary Certificate for Exports (Dairy Products): No specific attestation required. Standard attestation preprinted on the certificate is acceptable.
- Phytosanitary Certificate: Exact attestation may vary depending on product and State/region of origin. The following language may serve as an example.

“The plants or plant products have been inspected according to appropriate procedures, and they are considered to be free from quarantine pests, practically free from other injurious pests, and conform to the current phytosanitary regulations of the importing country.”

For specific attestation requirements, U.S. suppliers should have the importing party consult with Guyana’s NPPO.

- Health Certificate (for export of fishery products intended for human consumption): No specific attestation is required. Standard attestation preprinted on the certificate is acceptable.
- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Cattle.

“I, the undersigned USDA accredited veterinarian, certify to the following statements.

- 1. The United States is free of contagious bovine pleuropneumonia and foot and mouth disease.*
- 2. The United States is recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) as a country having a negligible risk status for bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE).*
- 3. The herd of origin has been free of clinical cases of bovine cysticercosis, enzootic bovine leukosis, hemorrhagic septicemia, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR), and malignant catarrhal fever (MCF) for the last 12 months prior to export.*
- 4. The cattle for export were tested within 60 days of export with negative results for the diseases listed below:*

a. Tuberculosis: Intradermal test using bovine PPD tuberculin OR other test accepted by USDA. Test Date(s): _____

b. Brucellosis: Complement fixation test at a 1:10 dilution OR buffered Brucella antigen test (i.e., card test) OR Enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (ELISA) or standard tube test OR fluorescent Polarization Assay (FPA) OR plate agglutination test at a 1:50 dilution OR other test accepted by USDA. Test Date(s): _____

c. Leptospirosis:

[O] The animals for export were treated once against leptospirosis with one injection of long-acting broad spectrum antibiotic once within 10 days of export.

[O] The animals for export were vaccinated against leptospirosis within 60 days prior to export.

[O] The animals for export were tested negative for leptospirosis within 60 days prior to export.

- 5. Within 14 days prior to the export, the animals for export were inspected and treated for internal and external parasites. Date(s) of Treatment: _____ Name(s) of Product: _____*

The animals were inspected within 14 days prior to export and found to be free from clinical signs of contagious diseases of the species.

If bovine dermatophilosis (a.k.a. rain rot or rain scald) is present, the animals were subjected to appropriate treatment prior to departure.

The animals for export will receive a USDA veterinary inspection at the port of embarkation, within 48 hours of export, and only those animals found free of evidence of communicable disease and fit for travel, will be permitted for export.”

- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Bovine Semen.

“At the time of semen collection, the donor bulls were free from clinical evidence of infectious and parasitic disease, including brucellosis, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR), bovine viral diarrhea (BVD), tuberculosis, trichomoniasis, and campylobacteriosis.”

- **Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Horses**

“1. The United States has been free from foot and mouth disease for at least twentyfour (24) months immediately prior to the date of exportation of the animals.

2. The United States is free from Dourine and Glanders.

3. No cases of equine infectious anemia, vesicular stomatitis, equine encephalomyelitis, mange, contagious equine metritis, equine influenza, equine piroplasmosis, equine viral arteritis, or equine rhinopneumonitis have been diagnosed on the premises from which the horses originate during the period of sixty (60) days immediately prior to the period of exportation.

4. The animals were tested, with negative results, for equine infectious anemia (EIA) within 6 months prior to export with an AGID or ELISA test.

5. The animals were vaccinated against equine encephalomyelitis (Eastern and Western), and equine influenza within one month prior to export.

6. The animals were treated for external and internal parasites within 7 days prior to exportation with approved products with residual activity against internal and external parasites.

7. In accordance with U.S. Code of Federal Regulations 9 part 91, the animals will be inspected by USDA APHIS at the port of embarkation within 48 hours or less prior to their embarkation, to ensure they are free from clinical signs of the disease listed in this certificate or any other infectious or contagious disease of concern to the species.”

- **Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Sheep and Goats**

“I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

a. The United States has been free of foot and mouth disease (FMD) without vaccination, for a period of at least twenty-four (24) months immediately prior to the date of exportation of the animals.

The United States is free of contagious caprine pleuropneumonia (CCPP) and peste des petits ruminants.

b. The farm of origin of the animals for export is under the oversight of a USDA Accredited Veterinarian.

c. The animals for export are physically sound, in good health, and are free from clinical signs of scrapie and other WOAHP notifiable diseases or other contagious diseases of small ruminants.

d. Insofar as it has been possible to ascertain, the herd of origin for the animals for export:

1. Has not had a confirmed case of clinical scrapie in the last three (3) years prior to export.

2. Has had no clinical cases of tuberculosis, caprine arthritis encephalitis (for goats, only), maedi-visna (for sheep, only), caseous lymphadenitis, vesicular stomatitis, or bluetongue in the last three (3) years prior to export; OR animals for export were test negative, as listed below.

3. Has had no clinical cases of *Chlamydophila abortus* (enzootic abortion of ewes) in the last two (2) years prior to export.

4. Has had no clinical cases of bovine brucellosis (*Brucella abortus*) or contagious epididymitis (*Brucella ovis*) in the last twelve (12) months prior to export; OR animals for export were test negative, as listed below.

e. The animals for export that are unable to meet Items 2. and 4. above, have been subjected to WOAHA approved serological tests with negative results for caprine arthritis encephalitis (for goats, only), maedi-visna (for sheep, only), caseous lymphadenitis, vesicular stomatitis, brucellosis and bluetongue, during pre-export isolation.

f. The animals for export have been in isolation in facilities approved by a USDA Accredited Veterinarian, for a minimum of 30 days prior to export, where no cases of anthrax were officially declared during that period.

g. The animals for export were treated with _____, a product that provides broadspectrum coverage against internal parasites, and with _____, an approved product for use against external parasites, during pre-export isolation.

h. The animals will receive USDA veterinary inspection within 48 hours of export, and be found free of evidence of communicable diseases, and fit to travel.”

- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Sheep and Goats Embryos.

“I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

1. The United States has been free from Foot and Mouth Disease without vaccination for a period of at least twelve (12) months immediately prior to the date of flushing and cryo-freezing of the embryos for export.

The United States is free of contagious caprine pleuropneumonia (CCPP) and peste des petits ruminants.

2. Insofar as it has been possible to ascertain, the herd of origin for the embryo donors:

a. Has not had a confirmed case of clinical scrapie in the last three (3) years prior to export of embryos.

b. Has had no clinical cases of maedi-visna (for sheep, only), caprine arthritis encephalitis (for goats, only), vesicular stomatitis, or bluetongue in the last three (3) years prior to export of embryos; OR embryo donors were test negative, as listed below.

c. Has had no clinical cases of *Chlamydophila abortus* (enzootic abortion of ewes) in the last two (2) years prior to export of embryos.

d. Has had no clinical cases of bovine brucellosis (Brucella abortus) or contagious epididymitis (Brucella ovis), in the last twelve (12) months prior to export of embryos; OR the donor animals were tested negative using Complement Fixation (CF) or a serum agglutination test with internationally approved antigens for brucellosis, either within six months prior to or six months after the collection of the embryos for export.

e. Has had no clinical cases of anthrax in the last twelve (12) months prior to export of embryos.

4. The donor animals were physically sound, in good health, and free from clinical signs of any WOAHA listed infectious or contagious disease for the species, on the date of embryo collection.

5. The embryos for export originate from a facility that is under the oversight of a USDA Accredited Veterinarian.”

- **Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Sheep and Goats Semen.**

“I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

(a) The United States has been free from Foot and Mouth Disease without vaccination for a period of at least twelve (12) months immediately prior to the date of export of semen.

(b) The donor animals were physically sound, in good health, and free from clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease for the species, on the date of semen collection.

(c) Insofar as it has been possible to ascertain, the herd of origin for the semen donors has not had a confirmed case of clinical scrapie in the last three (3) years prior to export of semen.

(d) Insofar as it has been possible to ascertain, the herd of origin for the semen donors has had no clinical cases of bovine brucellosis (Brucella abortus) or contagious epididymitis (Brucella ovis) in the last twelve (12) months prior to export of semen; OR the donor animals was tested negative for brucellosis using a WOAHA approved test prior to the collection of the semen for export.”

- **Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Swine**

“I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

a. The United States has been free of foot and mouth disease (FMD) without vaccination, for a period of at least twenty-four (24) months immediately prior to the date of exportation of the animals.

b. The United States has been free of classical swine fever (CSF) and African swine fever (ASF) for a period of at least twenty-four (24) months immediately prior to the date of exportation of the animals.

c. The farms of origin of the animals for export are under the oversight of a USDA Accredited Veterinarian.

d. The animals for export are physically sound, in good health, and are free from clinical signs of swine flu, swine brucellosis, anthrax, pseudorabies (Aujeszky's disease), porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS), porcine epidemic diarrhea (PED) and leptospirosis.

e. The farms of origin of the animals for export have had no clinical cases of any of the following diseases for the twenty-four (24) months immediately prior to the date of export: swineflu, anthrax and leptospirosis.

f. The farms of origin of the animals for export have had no clinical cases of any of the following diseases for the twenty-four (24) months immediately prior to the date of export OR the animals for export were tested negative during isolation using WOAHA approved test methods, as listed below: pseudorabies (Aujeszky's disease), swine brucellosis, transmissible gastroenteritis (TGE), porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome (PRRS), porcine epidemic diarrhea (PED).

g. The farms of origin of the animals for export have had no clinical cases of trichinellosis or porcine cysticercosis for the twenty-four (24) months immediately prior to the date of export, and after due inquiry I am satisfied that the animals for export have never been fed garbage at any time.

h. The animals for export were placed in pre-export isolation facility (quarantine) approved and overseen by the USDA Accredited Veterinarian, for at least thirty (30) days prior to shipment.

i. Regarding leptospirosis, EITHER:

[O] The animals for export were treated within 7 days prior to export with longacting oxytetracycline at a dose effective against *Leptospira* species.

[O] The animals for export were test negative for leptospirosis using a microtiter agglutination test for *Leptospira pomona*, *L. hardjo*, *L. grippotyphosa*.

j. During the period of isolation, the animals for export have been treated against endoparasites (helminths), using (name of drug): _____ and for ectoparasites* (blood feeding insects), using (name of drug): _____”

NOTE: This treatment is exempted during the season where it is not suitable for the activity for the blood sucking insects and their vectors. This would be indicated with an "N/A" above.

- Veterinary Health Certificate for Export of Swine Semen.

“I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify to the following statements:

(a) The United States has been free of foot and mouth disease (FMD) without vaccination, for a period of at least twelve (12) months immediately prior to the date of exportation of semen.

(b) Either the donor animals originate from a validated swine brucellosis-free herd or a swine brucellosis-Free state as determined by APHIS; OR donor boars were tested negative for swine brucellosis using WOAHA approved test methods prior to the collection of semen for export, as noted below.

(c) The donor animals were physically sound, in good health, and free from clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease for the species, on the date of semen collection.

(d) The semen for export originates from an APHIS approved collection center which adheres to the standards of the WOAHA Terrestrial Animal Health Code.”

Section IV. Government Certificate Legal Entry Requirements

As a general rule, all certificates must be originals and must accompany the product at the time of entry. Certificates should only apply to a specific consignment. Exemptions to this rule allowing certificates to apply to multiple (split) shipments need to be granted by the relevant regulatory agency in Guyana.

Export certificates are expected to be issued by a competent authority in the country of origin that inspects the facility/product(s) and can attest as to the sanitary health and/or food safety status of the product. A supplier's or manufacturer's export declaration is not acceptable as proof of compliance.

In terms of the Certificate of Free Sale requirement, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Certificate to a Foreign Government is acceptable. An exception to this applies to products exported through Miami. In such case, a Certificate of Free Sale and Sanitation issued by SelectFlorida, Inc. is acceptable.

All exports of red meat, red meat products, poultry meat, and poultry meat products must be certified by an FSIS Form 9060-5: Meat and Poultry Export Certificate of Wholesomeness issued through the Public Health Information System (PHIS). All FSIS export certificates for exports of red meat, red meat products, poultry meat, and poultry meat products must be signed by an FSIS veterinarian. The PHIS will apply "DVM" to the digital signature.

In terms of the Phytosanitary Certificate requirement, Guyana is a participant in Electronic Phytosanitary Certification (ePhyto) and accepts ePhyto's from USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS). However, given the technical nature of phytosanitary trade requirements, for exports of fruits, vegetables, plants, or plant products it is recommended that U.S. suppliers contact the appropriate APHIS Phytosanitary Issues Management Trade Director to determine if a commodity is admissible into Guyana. Trade Directors are the primary points of contact for communications with the National Plant Protection Organizations (NPPOs) of trading partner countries concerning phytosanitary issues. If the commodity is admissible, the Trade Director will provide Guyana's import requirements for the commodity. A link to APHIS' Phytosanitary Issues Management page providing contact information for the Trade Director covering Guyana can be found in Appendix III.

Section V. Other Certification/Accreditation Requirements to Ensure Market Entry

Certain agricultural products (i.e., live plants and plant products, live animals and animal products) require importers to obtain a valid import permit from the Guyana Ministry of Agriculture prior to import. Normally, these import permits will specify the requirements that must be met in order to import a specific product into Guyana. U.S. exporters should work closely with their importer in Guyana to ensure that where necessary a valid import permit has been obtained prior to all shipments.
