**Report Category:** FAIRS Export Certificate Report

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## **Report Highlights:**

This report lists the major certificates required by the Burmese government agencies for U.S agricultural products exported to Burma. The list of certificates primarily focuses on major U.S agricultural exports to Burma, such as soybeans and soybean meal, wheat products, distillers dried grains with solubles, meat and poultry products, fruits and vegetables, other grocery items, and seeds. This report reflects updated certificate requirements for imported meat, poultry, animal feed, and human food products. There are no changes in the certificate requirements from the previous report.

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### **Executive Summary:**

The Burmese government requires several certificates for imported agricultural products. In Burma (also called Myanmar) most product categories require third-party certificates, such as good manufacturing practices (GMP) plus Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point (HACCP), or ISO 22000 (food safety management) certificates in addition to federal phytosanitary, sanitary, or health certificates. In addition, import licenses are required for most agricultural products that the United States currently exports to Burma. This report summarizes the Burmese government's certification requirements for imported agricultural products by category. Additional information about import requirements is available in FAS Burma's FAIRS narrative report.

### Disclaimer:

This report was prepared by Office of Agricultural Affairs in Rangoon for U.S. exporters of domestic food and agricultural products. The report was prepared four months after the February 1 coup by the Burmese armed forces. FAS' connections with the Burmese government are currently limited due to a variety of factors, including the unstable security situation and the dismissal of Burmese officials due to their participation in the Civil Disobedience Movement. Additional information about the military coup and its impact is available in FAS Rangoon's recent reports. While every possible care has been taken in the preparation of this report, information provided may not be completely accurate either because policies have changed since its preparation, or because clear and consistent information about these policies was not available. It is highly recommended that U.S. exporters verify the full set of import requirements with their foreign customers, who are normally best equipped to research such matters with local authorities, before any goods are shipped.

- \* Free sale certificates are not required for imported products, but Myanmar FDA sometimes accepts them on a case-by-case basis as an alternative for GMP certificates.
- \*\* If the imported feed is to be used as fish feed, the required certificates should be submitted to DOF instead.

### SECTION II: PURPOSE OF SPECIFIC EXPORT CERTIFICATES

The purpose of each specific export certificate is reflected in Section 1. For more information, please visit the following website: <a href="https://myanmartradeportal.gov.mm/en">https://myanmartradeportal.gov.mm/en</a>.

As noted in Section 1, Health Certificates are required for animal products and byproducts for human consumption and livestock feed and must be signed by an authorized veterinary officer. These certify that the product is safe and wholesome.

For plant-based feed ingredients (e.g., soybean meal, DDGS, and corn gluten meal), a COA is required for each shipment for quality assurance and feed safety purposes. Product specifications are required, and COA must be submitted for quality assurance and food safety purposes to ensure the products meet the product specifications.

For processed foods, semi-processed foods, and beverages, a COA is required for each shipment (or per lot if multiple lots are in the shipment) for food safety purposes. Required testing varies by product category, but may include microbiological, chemical, and/or heavy metal testing. The results must meet CODEX recommendations.

Most imported agricultural products require an import license to certify that the product is approved to enter Burma. The Department of Trade from the Ministry of Commerce (MOC) is responsible for issuing import licenses for both agricultural and non-agricultural products that require them. On October 22, 2020, MOC published a revised list of goods that requires import licenses based on the most recent version of Burma's harmonized tariff code (2017). With this notification, some products (e.g., buttermilk) no longer require an import license. ## SECTION III: SPECIFIC ATTESTATION REQUIRED ON CERTIFICATE

The general attestation requirements are summarized in the table in Section 1. Any specific attestations are product specific.

## SECTION IV: GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATE ENTRY REQUIREMENT

The original certificates must accompany the imported product at the time of entry. Phytosanitary, sanitary, and health certificate cannot be used for multiple shipments. However, GMP, HACCP, and ISO certificates can be used for multiple shipments if they remain valid. As noted in Section II, COAs are requires for several product categories and, when required, must be conducted for each shipment. Free sale certificates are not required for imported products, but Myanmar FDA sometimes accepts them on a case-by-case basis as an alternative for GMP certificates.

# SECTION V: OTHER CERTIFICATION/ ACCREDITATION REQUIREMENTS TO ENSURE MARKET ENTRY

If the product is re-exported through a third country, an additional phytosanitary certificate (PC) will be required by that country. If a third country mentions that the phytosanitary certificate was issued for reexport, then the phytosanitary certificate from the country of origin must also accompany the re-export phytosanitary certificate.
