This report lists and describes certificates and other documents that must accompany food and agricultural imports to Chile as required by Chilean regulations. There are no changes from the previous version of this report.

Executive Summary

This report outlines the necessary certificates that need to accompany all imports of food products to Chile. The Chilean Agricultural and Livestock Service (SAG) requires certifications to prevent the introduction of plant pests or animal diseases in Chile while the Ministry of Health (MOH) protects human health. A certificate of origin is required by the customs office to apply import tariff benefits, all U.S. products are duty free since January 1, 2015.

Section II. Purpose of Specific Export Certificate(s)

The Government of Chile requires that all imported food and agricultural products be accompanied by three documents: Certificate of Origin, Certificate of Free Sale, and the Sanitary or Phytosanitary Certificate.

- a. **Certificate of Origin:** This certificate states the product's country of origin. The purpose of this certificate is to establish if a preferential duty rate is applicable. This document must always accompany the product. In the United States, the office of [Customs and Border Protection](#) provides a template for this certificate. A sample of the certificate is in the Appendix.
- b. **Certificate of Free Sale:** This document certifies that the product has sanitary authorization and is sold in the country of origin. In the United States, [FDA](#) and [State Departments of Agriculture and Public Health](#) issue this certificate. This document must always accompany the product. A sample state free sale certificate is in the Appendix.
- c. **Sanitary or Phytosanitary certificate:** Depending on the nature of the product, exporters must provide either a sanitary or phytosanitary certificate. A sanitary certificate is required for animal products, while a phytosanitary certificate is required for plant products (i.e. fruits, vegetables).
 - o **Sanitary Certificate:** In the United States, this document is issued by the Food Safety Inspection Service ([FSIS](#)) for all meat products, and by the Agricultural Marketing Service ([AMS](#)) for dairy products. It certifies that the animal product and byproducts were carefully examined and comply with all the sanitary requirements of Chile. This certificate may include specific declarations. A sample certificate is included in the Appendix.

It is extremely important when exporting any agricultural/animal product to Chile, the name, address, and official number of the plant on the sanitary certificate matches the name, address, and official number on the label of the product (s).

Note: See Section V for production process monograph/registration requirements.

- o **Phytosanitary Certificate:** In the United States, this document is issued by the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service ([APHIS](#)) and certifies that the plants, parts of plants, or vegetable products have been carefully examined and comply with all of the phytosanitary requirements of the importing country, which are specified in the additional declarations.

For vegetable products unregulated by Chilean laws, the importer must submit a Pest Risk Analysis (PRA) petition to SAG prior to import. You can find a sample of the certificate in the attachment and the complete risk characterization [here](#).

- d. Other Specific Certifications

Certificate of Custom Destination and the Certificate of Use and Disposal from the Ministry of Health

The Certificate of Custom Destination is a certificate used to move the product from the custom's warehouse to a private one, which reduces the importing company's storage costs.

The Certificate of Use and Disposal is the document issued by the Ministry of Health (*SEREMI de Salud*) and allows the product to be sold to the public. In order to issue this certificate, the *SEREMI de Salud* is entitled to sample the products using the parameters established in Title V, Article 173 of the [Food Sanitary Regulations \(RSA\)](#).

Pharmaceutical and Foods with Medicinal Properties: No additional certificates are required.

SAG will approve the pharmaceutical and foods with medicinal properties products for import within 3 days, if it is within compliance. Sample certificates are in the Appendix.

Section III. Specific Attestation Required on Export Certificate(s)

Animal and Animal Products

Depending on the nature of the product, Chile requires specific declarations on the certificates. Chile and USDA authorities have negotiated protocols and declarations for all U.S. products eligible to be exported to Chile. To review the list of eligible products to export to Chile, please review the [FSIS Export library](#), the [APHIS IREGS](#), and the [NOAA export requirements](#).

In the case of beef, pork, poultry and their products, Chile requires the FSIS Form 9060-5 and additional declarations related to the sanitary status of the country and animal health. Those declarations can be found on the [FSIS Export Library](#).

For animal health declarations, this includes live animal (horses, cattle, one-day chicks, birds, zoo animals, laboratory animals), reproductive material like embryos and semen, please refer to the [APHIS Chile -Summary of Requirements for Live Animals](#). For animal feeds, pet food and chews, planktonic species intended for animal feeding, poultry feathers and poultry meals please refer to [APHIS Animal Products to Chile](#).

Prepared Foods

Processed food products (for human or animal consumption) with ingredients of animal origin must obtain prior authorization from SAG. The exporter must submit the process monograph to SAG for each product. Products authorized under this method are listed on the "Official List of Products Authorized to be Exported to Chile by Monograph". A copy of the guide to prepare the process monograph can be found in the Appendix section. Products authorized under this method will not need further certification but their ingredients must come from a plant or establishment authorized to export to Chile. In the case of beef and poultry, all establishments under Federal supervision are eligible to

export to Chile. In the case of dairy products, the ingredients must come from a plant listed on the [FDA list](#) of plants that have interest in exporting to Chile. If the product contains more than one ingredient of animal origin, it needs to have a certificate for each of the ingredients.

Fishery Products

There are two certificates negotiated between Chilean Fishery Agency (SERNAPESCA) and the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) that are for exclusive use for Chile.

1. **Certificate of Legal Origin:** This document certifies that the aquatic resource identified herein and under the described conditions was obtained by individuals authorized to engage in fishing activities in accordance with the standing national and international fisheries regulations applicable in their country of origin. It further certifies that the aquatic resource used to process the product described, and under the described conditions, was obtained and processed by individuals authorized to engage in such activities, in accordance to standing national and international regulations applicable in their country of origin. A copy of the certificate can be found in the Appendix.
2. **Export Health Certificate:** This certificate is used to export live and processed lobster to Chile. The declaration states that the product was inspected for quality and condition, the product was found to be alive, good quality and condition and fit for human consumption. A copy of the certificate can be found in the Appendix.

Plants and Vegetable Products

U.S. exports of plants and vegetable products to Chile require a certificate with specific declarations issued by APHIS. The purpose of the declaration is to ensure Chilean authorities that imports do not represent a risk to the biodiversity of the country.

The specific requirements in Spanish can be found in SAG's website [Phytosanitary Requirements for Plant and Vegetable Imports](#). Exporters should contact their APHIS representative, prior to export, to obtain the proper certification.

Section IV. Government Certificate's Legal Entry Requirements

- Chilean authorities only accept original documents. However, due to COVID-19 the Agricultural and Livestock Service (SAG) is accepting electronic copies to clear shipments. The importer needs to present online affidavit stating that the original certificate will be given to SAG within 60 days.
- Certificates are required for each single shipment.
- Certificates of free sale may be issued by state or federal authorities. Sanitary or phytosanitary certificates must be issued by a Federal regulatory agency.
- Chilean authorities specifically require a Certificate of Free Sale.

Section V. Other Certification/Accreditation Requirements

Production process monograph/registration requirements

Prior to import, some animal products and animal sub-products must undergo a monograph evaluation. Among the products that need to be evaluated are feathers, wool, egg byproducts, meat and meat products (bovine, pork, and poultry), animal feed- like ingredients, and formulated additives in any of their forms.

Some aspects to consider before submitting the monograph:

- It is a process done prior to import and does not replace the documents required by Customs and the Sanitary Certificate.
- Due to the complexity of the data evaluated, the Chilean Ministry of Agriculture (SAG) requires at least 30 days to review the data/form before approving it.
- The form submitted to SAG must be completed in Spanish and will not be processed until all the information is provided.
- The Appendix provides a guide on how to submit the monograph.

6.- Guide to Prepare and Submit a Production Process Monograph

GUIDE TO PREPARE A PROCESS MONOGRAPH OF PRODUCTS DESTINED FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION

I. INTRODUCTION:

According to what is established in point 4 of resolution 3138/1999, are excluded from the process of authorization of industrial production facilities of animal origin (feathers or wools, eggs byproducts, poultry products, among others) that present the process monograph to be analyzed and approved as with no sanitary risk to the country.

II. PRODUCTION PROCESS MONOGRAPH

It is understood by monograph production process of a product, a document prepared by the manufacturer, where each of the constituents of the product is identified and in which a detail description of how the product is produced, from raw materials to obtain the final product is given. In the event that the product constitutes a means of introduction and spread of disease, the goal is to determine through the description of the production process, if at any stage of its production, it is subjected to a treatment that eliminates or reduces the risk to acceptable and manageable level.

III. INFORMATION THAT MUST BE PROVIDED ON THE PROCESS MONOGRAPH

1. Of the establishment
 - Name
 - Official number given by the sanitary authority
 - Address
 - Telephone number
 - E-mail
 - Country of origin
2. Of the raw materials of animal origin
 - Characterization of each commodity: origin (species, detailing the tissue or organ to be obtained).
 - Country of origin.
 - Copy of health certificate, when the raw materials come from a third country (only the evaluation at the Agriculture and Livestock Service (SAG), upon request).
 - Name and identification details of the supplier of the raw material only if it is part of a finished product.
3. Of the Production process
 - Production flow chart indicating in detail the procedures followed in making the product.
 - Program of Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP), good hygiene practices and HACCP (only if during the evaluation, SAG requested).

IV. PRESENTATION OF THE PROCESS MONOGRAPH TO THE SERVICE

- Letter containing all the information requested on the Annex directed to the Chief of the Livestock and Protection Division, Avda. Bulnes 140, 7th floor, Santiago
- Folder containing all the requested information as mentioned in point III from this guide (from 1 to 3) for each product, separately. The text must be legible and in the language of the country of origin with a translation in Spanish.

- The process monograph must be officialized by the competent sanitary authority of the country of origin by means of a name, signature, seal and date.

V. APPROVAL OR REJECTION

- If the result of the evaluation of the process monograph is satisfactory, SAG will authorize the product by issuing a special resolution of the National Directorate of SAG, which will be communicated to the Regional Offices by sending a copy of it.
- If the result of the evaluation of the monograph is negative, SAG will communicate its rejection to the applicant.
- This approval will be indefinite and will automatically terminate if the conditions for which this approval was granted change, ie, if the product is incorporated, subtract or make any changes in its structure, composition or physical state, production process or whether changes the processing establishment. Given this situation, the applicant must submit a new application letter paper production process where such changes are contemplated.
- The procedure for submission and approval of paper production process does not replace the process of admission of a product, so it must also meet health requirements. Therefore, each product batch or lot, when imported into the country, must be accompanied by the appropriate health certificate, to bring compliance with the general and specific sanitary requirements.

VI. OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- The maximum time required to decide on the approval or rejection of a paper will be 30 working days. This term also applies to those applications for approval of product monographs that are being held at ports of entry into the country.
- The 30 working days start on the date on which all the required background for the monograph is presented. Should be incomplete or required additional information, this period will be considered once they have completed the required documentation.
