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Report Highlights:

This report lists major export certificates required by the Taiwan government to export food and agricultural products to Taiwan. For more information on import requirements, see the Taiwan Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards Report.

Executive Summary:

This report was prepared by the American Institute in Taiwan's Office of Agricultural Affairs in Taipei, Taiwan for U.S. exporters of food and agricultural products. This report gives an overview of Taiwan's certificate requirements for food and agricultural products. While this report strives to be as comprehensive as possible, regulations and requirements can frequently change. U.S. exporters are therefore encouraged to work closely with their Taiwan importers to ensure they are aware of and complying with all current Taiwan regulations and requirements.

Taiwan requires official U.S. government-issued export certificates for many products including meat, poultry, eggs, dairy, fresh fruit and vegetables, as well as seafood, livestock feed, and organic products, among others. In particular, beef products require special certification under an export verification program. Original certificates should accompany the product at the time of entry for all government-issued certificates.

Final import approval of any product is subject to rules and regulations as interpreted by Taiwan border officials at the time of product entry.

One of the following phytosanitary certificate formats will be accepted by BAPHIQ as an original phytosanitary certificate:

- 1. A phytosanitary certificate printed on security paper with either digital signature or wet signature; or
- 2. A phytosanitary certificate printed on plain paper and personally signed by a USDA inspector; or
- 3. A phytosanitary certificate printed on plain paper with digital signature and official embossed seal of the competent quarantine authorities of the United States.

Section IV: Government Certificate Legal Entry Requirements

All original certificates are required to accompany the corresponding products at the port of entry, unless otherwise specified in the table above. Taiwan authorities generally only accept certificates

issued by the exporting country's competent government authority. Private industry issued certificates are not accepted. Any revision on the affidavit or text on the certificates must be either signed by an eligible endorsing official or reissued with a certificate including the new affidavit or new text as replacement.

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Section V: Other Certification/Accreditation Requirements

Apart from export certificates, products imported into Taiwan must also meet several other requirements. Details of these requirements are contained in the FAIRS narrative report updated each year by this office. The most recent update is dated December 2021, in conjunction with this report.
