Trade Policy Monitoring GOI Notifies TRQ Procedure 2002

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Report Highlights:

Indian government has recently notified the procedure for allocation of TRQs (01/22/02), but requires imports to be completed by the end of India's fiscal year (03/31/02).

GOI Notifies TRQ Import Procedures

India's Director General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) recently notified procedures for allocation of various agricultural products covered under Tariff Rate Quotas (TRQ), such as corn, milk powder, and sunflower/safflower/rapeseed oils. Designated entities for allocation of TRQs are:

Note: Imports of all the above products by government entities (STC, MMTC, NAFED, PEC, NCDF, etc.) are required to be on behalf of actual users.

According to the notification, all eligible entities interested in availing of the TRQ for Indian fiscal year 2001/02 (Apr-Mar) are to apply to the Exim Facilitation Committee (EFC) in the

DGFT's office by February 11, 2002, with imports to be completed before March 31, 2002. Allocation of TRQs among the applicants is to be made by the EFC in a meeting chaired by the Director General of Foreign Trade, and including representatives of the Department of Revenue (Ministry of Finance), Department of Agriculture and Cooperation, Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, and Edible Oil Commissioner. Failure to complete the imports on time would make the entity ineligible for allocation of any quota for any item for the next two years.

Comment: The late notification of the TRQ import procedure, and the requirement that imports occur by the end of this fiscal year (March 31, 2002), makes import of these commodities under the TRQ virtually impossible.
