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Report Name: Grain and Feed Market Update

Country: Bulgaria

Post: Sofia

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Report Highlights:

Bulgaria's wheat and barley harvests are underway and farmers are reporting lower than expected yields and inconsistent quality. As of July 9, 2020, Bulgaria's wheat harvest was 74 percent complete and reported average yields were about 30 percent lower from the previous year, with total production reported at 3.3 million metric tons (MMT). The barley harvest is roughly 93 percent complete and average yields were down 14 percent from last year. The wheat and barley crops are lower than expected due to dry weather during critical crop development stages, especially in northeastern Bulgaria's main production region. Post estimates the marketing year (MY) 2020/21 wheat crop down to 5.4 MMT and barley crop at 570,000 metric tons (MT). Bulgaria's corn area reached an all-time high and production is forecast at 3.9 MMT, just below MY 2019/20's 4.0 MMT record.

Weather Overview

The fall 2019 winter crop planting season was excessively dry and was followed by below-normal levels of precipitation and mild weather in winter 2019/20. According to the European Union's (EU) Monitoring Agricultural Resources (MARS) Bulletin Vol.28, No 6, near- to above-average rainfall in June 2020 improved soil moisture and conditions for corn, but arrived too late to significantly bolster winter grain yields. Precipitation during the first and last weeks of May was mostly above average, although it was not enough to fully meet the needs of winter crops undergoing heading and flowering. The soil moisture deficit was especially pronounced in eastern Bulgaria. May to mid-June brought alternating warm weather and unseasonably chilly weather. As of mid-June, soil moisture levels in winter crop fields were mostly below average, except in western Bulgaria, where average rainfall levels prevailed. Corn benefited from increasing rainfall in most regions.

MY 2020/21 Forecast

Wheat: According to the Bulgarian Ministry of Agriculture (MinAg), this year's wheat area planted is four percent higher over the previous year (Table 4). As of July 9, the wheat harvest was 74 percent complete, with average yields at 3.77 MT/HA, a 30-percent decline from last year's yields. Reported production was 3.3 MMT (MinAg Weekly Bulletin #28, July 15, 2020). This year's wheat harvest is more advanced than last year, which was five percent complete as of early July 2019.

Farmers are reporting disappointing yields, especially in eastern Bulgaria, where dry conditions in the spring were more pronounced. Some farmers from in the northeastern region of Dobrudza reported yields of 1.0-2.0 MT/HA. Reported yields in northcentral and northwestern Bulgaria were significantly better due to more rainfall. Quality is mixed, but the overall share of milling quality wheat is likely to be higher. Farmers report lower hectoliter, and higher gluten and protein contents.

Private wheat production estimate vary with the lowest from the National Grain Association at 4.1 MMT and up to 5.6 MMT from some traders. Post currently estimates the wheat crop at 5.4 MMT (4.6 MT/HA), although further revisions may occur as the harvest progresses.

According to Post sources, the recent uptick in wheat prices is leading to contract defaults, as some farmers are reportedly underreporting production to avoid contracted deliveries. These farmers are eager to keep their wheat to sell on the higher spot market. The early uptick in export demand for Bulgarian wheat is contributing to this phenomenon.

Barley: The barley harvest is 93 percent (Table 4) complete with average yields reported at 4.12 MT/HA, a 14-percent decline from MY 2019/20. The barley area planted was 20 percent higher this MY. As of July 9, reported production reached 522,000 MT. Post currently estimates the total barley crop at 570,000 MT with average yields of 4.22 MT/HA.

Corn: This year's corn area reached 584,000 HA, a record high, as reported by MinAg as of June 25. May and June rains have helped the corn crop develop well, to date. Favorable July weather during tasseling will be critical for Bulgaria's corn crop. Private yield estimates vary widely from 6.5 MT/HA to 7.7 MT/HA, meaning total production could range from 3.77 MMT to 4.45 MMT. Post currently estimates the corn crop at 3.9 MMT, slightly below last year.

MY 2019/20 Production Estimates and Trade

The total area harvested for cereal grains in MY 2019/20 increased by six percent. Total cereal production increased by 10 percent over MY 2018/19 (Table 1). According to Eurostat, the final wheat production number was 6.32 MMT, a six-percent increase over MY 2018/19, due to a 7.5-percent increase in average yields (5.27 MT/HA) (Table 1). Record-level corn production reached 4.0 MMT, mainly on a 26-percent increase in area planted.

Higher domestic stocks and favorable export demand increased exports. Early official data for MY 2019/20 shows wheat exports up by 28 percent and barley exports also up 57 percent over MY 2018/19. As of June 30, MY 2019/20 corn exports were up 35 percent, due to strong demand outside of the EU.

Wheat: Wheat farm-gate prices in MY 2019/20 were below last year (Graph 1). Stable stocks, competitive prices, higher quality, and favorable export demand drove wheat exports. As of early July 2020, MinAg <u>reported</u> MY 2019/20 wheat exports at 4.8 MMT, a 28-percent increase over MY 2018/19 (Tables 2 and 3). Export growth to non-EU markets increased more than tripled over the previous MY.

According to Eurostat (Trade Data Monitor/TDM based on Eurostat), wheat exports during the first nine months of MY 2019/20 were 4.52 MMT, mostly to Spain, Greece, Portugal, Romania, South Korea, and Indonesia. This marks a 25-percent increase over the first nine months of MY 2018/19. As of June 30, authorities reported wheat stocks at 290,000 MT, down from 440,000 MT from the same period in MY 2018/19.

Barley: Barley farm-gate prices were below MY 2018/19 (Graph 1). Barley exports in MY 2019/20 increased by 57 percent over the previous MY. Export trends were similar to wheat, with a 60-percent increase to non-EU markets (Tables 2 and 3). According to Eurostat/TDM data, exports during the first nine months of the MY were at 273,000 MT, mainly to Saudi Arabia, Spain, and Greece, a 74-percent increase over the first nine months of MY 2018/19. As of June 30, barley stocks were reported at 10,000 MT, up from 4,500 MT during the corresponding period of 2019.

Corn: Corn farm-gate prices have been higher this season due to stronger global demand (Graph 1). Exports through June were 35 percent higher than in MY 2018/19, per MinAg data. Corn exports to non-EU markets grew almost tripled, while exports within the EU declined by 13 percent. The latest Eurostat/TDM data for corn exports in the first half of MY 2019/20 show 1.58 MMT, a 45-percent increase over the corresponding period of MY 2018/19. FAS Sofia forecasts corn exports in MY2019/20 will reach 2.2 MMT.

Domestic corn consumption was stable, with a slight decline for feed use and higher industrial use among starch, ethanol and spirits distillers. Official corn stocks as of June 30 were reported at about 1.16 MMT, roughly on par with last year (1.23 MMT).












Map 2: USDA Crop Explorer, Europe, Surface and Subsurface Soil Moisture July 1-3
