## **Report Highlights:**

While updated data for area planted resulted in an increase in wheat production expectations, Spain's winter grains crop is still expected to be much lower than the previous year due to the early season dry growing conditions. Updated PS&D's for winter grains, corn, and rice are provided in this report.

## **Executive Summary**

Wet and relatively cool weather conditions, prevalent throughout most of Peninsular Spain since early May, helped development of the 1999/2000 winter grain crop in northern producing areas. However, the precipitation was too late for the earlier maturing crop in souther regions, which had already been severely effect by dry weather. Preliminary reports of extremely low yields in Andalucia, Extremadura, and southern Castilla La Mancha have confirmed earlier expectations for very short barley and wheat crops in southern Spain. Furthermore, pasture conditions remain very poor in the South. In response to the drought in the South, the GOS recently announced a disaster relief package that will subsidize financing and transport costs of feed ingredients (grains and alfalfa) from northern area to extensive livestock areas located in the south. The poor pasture conditions are encouraging the use of grain in extensive livestock areas. Meanwhile, production in north-central Spain (Castilla y Leon) is still expected to be relatively good as this region did not suffer the early dry period as in the South, and recent weather has helped crop development.

As a result of the availability of updated data on planted area (based on farmers' claims for area-based EU compensatory payments), wheat harvested area has been increased. Planted wheat area rose to an estimated 2.2 million hectares in 1999/00, a 17 percent increase from the previous year. The increase in area was proportionally greater in the north. As about 200,000 HA will not be harvested in drought-damage areas in the South, harvested area is expected to be about 2 million HA. Reportedly, farmers shifted from barley to wheat due to the relatively more favorable wheat prices in comparison with barley prices.

Due to the timely and needed rain over the past month in the north, in addition to the new data for planted area, the 1999/00 forecast for wheat output was increased from 3.5 to 4.2 million tons. As a result of the larger expected domestic crop, the wheat import forecast was reduced. The rains primarily benefitted the wheat produced in central and northern Spain, as the rains were too late and too scarce to help the earlier-maturing wheat in the south. As most durum is produced in the south, the durum crop gained little from the moisture, and almost all the increase in the forecast can be attributed to higher expectations for the bread wheat corp. For durum, while the new planting indicates more area than recently forecast, the production forecast was raised by only 50,000 tons. Of the estimated 819,000 HA originally planted to durum, only 500,000 is expected to be harvested. Wheat harvest continues to progress from southern Spain to the north and is about 40 percent completed. Harvest in the latest maturing areas of the North will begin in early July.

As a result of the recent rains and the unseasonably cool temperatures, the production forecast for 1999/00 barley crop was increased slightly. While it still depends on whether the Commission wishes to approve the export of Spain's relatively higher priced barley, the availability of an intervention export tender for Spain's barley may mean that up to 300,000 tons may be exported. Despite expectations for a lower domestic crop, barley prices were at or below intervention in recent weeks. Due to low prices, ending intervention stocks rose to about 1 million tons.

The forecast for corn production was reduced slightly to reflect lower estimated area. Despite lucrative direct payments, recent prices of about 22,000 pesetas (\$136) per ton in production areas were reportedly too low for marginal areas, which resulted in a drop in planted area. In 1999, around 1.6 million tons of corn have been purchased under Spain's reduced-duty corn import program. The remaining quota is around 400,000 tons. The overwhelming majority of imports under this program continue to be sourced from Argentina.
