Report Highlights:

In MY, the U.S. share of the Tunisian wheat imports dropped sharply to 6 percent compared to 34 percent the previous year as the direct result of extremely high EU export subsidies that exceeded 40 percent of the landed price of wheat throughout North Africa.

Executive Summary

Below average rainfall this year in the central and southern regions of Tunisia during seedbed preparation and seeding time resulted in reduced total ceral planted acreage. However, exceptionally abundant and well distributed rainfall across the major cereal producing regions of the country since January helped substantially cereal crops growth and development.

Total area planted in cereals in 1998/1999 declined 4 percent, to about 1.38 million Ha, compared to 1.44 million Ha in 1997/1998, but is about 14 percent short of the planned figure of 1.6 million HA. If favorable climatic conditions prevail until harvest time, total cereal production is forecast to reach about 2,500,000 MT (durum wheat 1,650,000 MT, bread wheat n 380,000 MT and barley 470,000 MT).

In order to meet its needs and, at the same time biuld up its stocks while international wheat and barley export prices are attractive, Tunisia will need to import in 1998/1999, an estimated 675,000 MT of bread wheat, 225,000 MT of durum wheat and 140,000 MT of barley.

Wheat

As a result of above average domestic production in 1998, all wheat imports for 1998/1999 decreased about 35 percent compared to their previous year's level of 1,392,000 MT while imports of barley decreased about 43 percent to 140,000 MT. In 1998, imports from the U.S., in terms of market share, dropped by 28 percent. This extremely sharp decline is essentially the direct result of extremely high EU export subsidies that, according to U.S. Wheat Associates, exceeded 40 percent of the landed price of wheat throughout North Africa, thus allowing EU wheat to undercut SRW prices by over \$10/MT on a CIF basis.

For bread wheat, in MY 1998/1999 (July 1998-June 1999), Tunisia purchased approximately 675,000 MT, of which 600,000 MT were delivered (50,000 MT from the U.S.). The remaining undelivered balance of 75,000 MT is of French origin. With respect to durum wheat for which Tunisia is generally self sufficient in high to average rainfall years, Tunisian imports amounted to approximately 225,000 MT, of which 150,000 MT were delivered. In terms of all wheat (durum and bread wheat combined), total Tunisian imports amount to approximately 900,000 MT, of which the U.S. share is about 6 percent compared to 34 percent the previous year. MY 1999 total exports of processed wheat products are estimated at 163,000 MT (wheat equivalent).

Wheat and barley imports for MY 1999/2000 are estimated as follows: durum wheat 150,000 MT, bread wheat 700,000 MT and barley 50,000 MT. The U.S. market share for wheat is projected to be about 260,000 MT, a 31 percent increase in market share.

Based on official GOT statistics, MY 1998 wheat production has been revised to 1,353,000 MT.

Wheat, Durum

MY 1999 estimated production and consumption are 1,650,000 MT and 1,220,000 MT, respectively, while Tunisian exports of pasta and couscous products are estimated at 20,000 MT (durum wheat equivalent MT).

Barley

MY 1998 ending stocks were revised upward based on recently released official statistics that corrected previous under estimated production figure for 1998.
