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Report Name: Grain and Feed Update

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Post: Hanoi

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Report Highlights:

For marketing year (MY) 2018/2019, Post revised total paddy production down compared to the USDA official number, from 44.68 million metric tons (MMT) to 44.43 MMT, or from 27.92 MMT to 27.77 MMT of milled rice, due to lower harvested area of the Autumn crop. Post forecasts that this drop in harvested area will continue into MY19/20. The export forecast for MY18/19 remains unchanged from the previous year, with decreasing demand from China and Indonesia being offset by increased demand from the Philippines and other countries.



For MY18/19, Post revised total paddy production down compared to the USDA official number, from 44.68 MMT to 44.43 MMT, or from 27.92 MMT to 27.77 MMT of milled rice. This is due to lower harvested area for the Autumn crop. Post forecasts that this drop in harvested area of the Autumn crop will also carry through into MY19/20.

Autumn Crop

The Autumn crop consists of Main Autumn and Late Autumn crops. In MY18/19, the climate was drier than usual and affected the autumn crop in the central region of Vietnam (Figure 1). According to a report by the Vietnamese Ministry of Agricultural Rural and Development (MARD), the planted area of the Autumn crop in the Mekong River Delta (MRD) decreased, but yield was higher than last year. Taking into account the unfavorable weather conditions, MARD encouraged farmers to switch to other crops in localities at risk of insufficient water supply. Therefore, Post reduced its estimate of the harvested area and production slightly for the Autumn crop as a whole, to 2,850 thousand hectares (THA) and 15.7 MMT.

The harvesting of the MY18/19 Main Autumn crop has finished, and the Late Autumn crop harvest has started in the MRD, with yield gains due to no reported incidents of unfavorable weather impacts. However, planted area in the MRD is estimated down as farmers switch to other crops, such as fruits and vegetables (Table 2).

TRADE / COMPETITION

Domestic Prices




Figure 2: Vietnamese Monthly Paddy Prices for the First Eight Months of 2014-2019

For the first eight months of the MY18/19, local paddy prices were unstable and dropped sharply to their lowest levels in the past five years during the harvesting of the Main Autumn crop in the MRD (Figure 2). Lower demand from China, the largest traditional importing market, and rumors of new tariff and non-tariff measures by the Philippines discouraged traders from paying higher prices.


Exports

In the first eight months of the MY18/19, Vietnam exported a total of 4.5 MMT of milled rice, almost unchanged from the previous year (Table 3; Figure 3). Post estimates the MY18/19 export volume at 6.5 MMT, similar to that in MY17/18, due to lack of purchases from traditional major markets such as China and Indonesia. The export volume to China was down substantially, by 70 percent, to approximately 0.3 MMT, with glutinous and jasmine rice suffering the most. Some foreign media outlets report that China will uphold the same tariff rate quota (TRQ) on imported grains in 2020, including a 5.4 MMT cap for rice from all sources. Together with a new tariff policy, which came in effect last July (VM8050), Vietnamese exports to the Chinese market will continue to face challenges in the coming year. Vietnamese exports to Indonesia have also seen a significant decline, by 90 percent, to approximately 0.05 MMT, reportedly due to high stock (1916) (Figure 4).

Lower exports to the Chinese and Indonesian markets were offset by increased volume to other markets such as the Philippines, Ivory Coast, and Oceania. The Philippines jumped to become the number one export market, with the volume increasing by 170 percent to nearly 2 MMT. However, rumors of possible applications of tariff and non-tariff measures by the Philippines have affected sales to this market recently (Figure 4).

Under the free trade agreement (FTA) signed in June, the EU has agreed to an 80,000 MT quota for Vietnamese rice at zero tariff. This is an opportunity for Vietnam to expand exports to the EU market, provided that Vietnam complies with its high food safety standards.

Figure 4: Vietnamese Rice Exports to Markets with Major Variations in the First Eight Months of MY18/19 (unit: MT)


