Report Highlights:

On April 13, CEFTA member countries implemented a regional green corridors system at certain border crossings. The system was introduced to facilitate the transport and trade of goods within the region, as new border and citizen protection measures to combat the coronavirus pandemic have greatly slowed traffic. Border crossings and green lanes within this system will be open for all goods, with humanitarian goods having higher priority, which requires pre-arranged coordination.

Trade Association:

On April 13, CEFTA member countries implemented a regional green corridors system at certain border crossings. The system was introduced to facilitate the transport and trade of goods within the region, as new border and citizen protection measures to combat the coronavirus pandemic have greatly slowed traffic. Border crossings and green lanes within this system will be open for all goods, with humanitarian goods having higher priority, which requires pre-arranged coordination. The CEFTA (Central European Free Trade Agreement) Secretariat officially announced that the system of green corridors in the Western Balkans region began to operate as of April 13.

CEFTA <https://cefta.int/> is a trade association of European countries that are non-EU member states. The free trade area encompasses seven nations that together cover a combined area of 97,463 square miles. There are six official languages in the region, but English is recognized as the region's working language. The free trade area is home to over 22 million people. The bloc has a robust economy, with a gross domestic product of \$400 billion, and a GDP per capita of \$14,102.

Green Corridor System:

The border crossings in the green corridor system will operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, as well as customs and other border services. In order to further ensure the rapid flow of the most essential products, CEFTA parties adopted a list of essential goods. Food and animal feed are deemed most important followed by personal protective products to fight against the coronavirus. Depending on the needs of CEFTA parties, this list may be modified.

The Systematic Electronic Exchange of Data for Customs Administrations (SEED) system has been upgraded and will be used to pre-code products from the core product list. The SEED system will send data electronically to customs and other border services (customs directly through the system, while the system will generate emails automatically forwarded to phytosanitary, veterinary and sanitary services for each crossing).

CEFTA countries are expecting that the established use of green corridors will continue to even after the coronavirus pandemic is over, thus enabling all the benefits of simplified and expeditious border crossing.
