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Report Highlights: This reports reviews Vietnam's CY-2000 rice export and

forecast for 2001. Production, supply and distribution estimates are slightly revised. Policies on 2001 rice export mechanism are also briefly discussed.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Despite severe floods in the Mekong River Delta (MRD), Vietnam's rice production in 2000 increased by 3.1% compared with 1999's level due to expanded areas and crop yield of 2000's Winter-Spring (W-S) rice and Lua Mua crops.

Vietnam's 2000 rice exports reached 3.37 million metric tons (MMT), far below the target of 4.3 MMT set by the Government due to lower demand from key rice importing countries like Indonesia and Malaysia. Competitive prices from low cost suppliers, like China and Pakistan, have also put pressure on the market for Vietnam's rice. Low exports will cause a big carry over stock in 2001. The Government of Vietnam (GVN) is seriously looking at plans to maximize the effectiveness of rice production. Further reform in 2001 will provide the private sector with a greater role in rice exporting.

RICE PRODUCTION

VN nearly completing harvest of 2000/01 Lua Mua crop, the yield slightly improving.

<u>In the North of Vietnam</u>: According Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (MARD) statistics, by the end of Nov. 2000, farmers in the North completed the harvest of 2000/01's Lua Mua crop on an areas of 1,278 thousand hectares (Tha). The estimated crop yield is about 4 MT/ha.

In the South, the total 2000/01's Lua Mua planted was about 981 Tha of which 478 Tha in MRD. As of Jan. 10, 2001, over 900 Tha of the Lua Mua has been harvested. Our recent trip to MRD showed that the crop is in good condition owing to a low incidence of pests and diseases. MARD estimates the average crop yield in the Southern region is 2.85 MT/ha.

Post revises Lua Mua area up to 2,259 Tha from previous estimation of 2,255 Tha due to an increase in MRD. The production revised up to 7.9 MMT at the projected average crop yield of 3.5 MT/ha (see Table 1).

The 2000/01's Winter-Spring (W-S) rice crop planted under favorable weather.

In the North: By early Jan. 2001, farmers in the North (mainly in the North Coastal province) transplanted about 65 Tha of W-S rice.

In the South: According to MARD, sowing of the 00/01 W-S rice crop has been well ahead of the normal schedule. Current planted area is about 1,530 THA, faster than the same period of last year by 16% mainly due to quicker planting implementation in MRD.

By Jan. 10, 2001, farmers in MRD has planted 1,315 Tha of W-S rice, an increase of 18% from the same period of 2000. The target for this region, Vietnam's biggest rice bowl, is set at 8 MMT on 1,560 Tha, a small increase of 1% compared with 2000's crop. This could be considered as a success story of MRD's farmers as they have just finish coping with severe floods.

Post's projection for this W-S crop remains unchanged.

The 2001 Summer -Autumn (S-A) crop is revised under MARD's target.

According to the MARD's proposal for rice production in 2001, smaller 2001 S-A crop is targeted as some coastal areas of late S-A rice crop will be used for more economic farming activities like shrimp raising.

Post revises the area for S-A crop down to 2,265 Tha, the same level of last year crop (see table 1).

Actual paddy and rice stock in 2000 was lower than expected.

In our recent trip to MRD, we found that rice supply available for export is not as big as reported. Rice processors and exporters claimed that it was not easy for them to purchase paddy and rice after MRD flooded. They approximated the buffer stocks at low level of 200 TMT. We understood that holding stock from farmers is a "phenomenon" for the year 2000 but that stock is not as big as MARD's estimation of 1 MMT. Moreover, the development of catfish raising and livestock husbandry consumed more rice products like rice bran, rice broken etc. Cheaper cost of rice encouraged farmers in utilizing more rice for their home - mixed feed. Therefore, Post revises the total domestic consumption to 16,617 TMT in 2000 from the previous number of 16,459 TMT. Consequently, the rice ending stock carried to 2001 is revised to 780 TMT from the previous number of 958 TMT (see PS&D table).

PRICES (Exchange Rate USED 1=VND14,520)

Domestic paddy and rice prices are slightly down due to Tet Lunar New Year.

To celebrate the Tet Lunar New Year (Jan 22-27), farmers need more money so they have to release some of their holding stocks to the market. As a result of better supply, prices of paddy and raw white rice in the MRD were soften slightly i.e. VND1,350-1,450/kg and VND 2,000-2,100/kg, respectively (see Table 2).

Export price.

Offers for Vietnam long grain white rice 5%; 10% and 25% broken are at \$166, \$161 and \$147, respectively (US\$/MT, FOB, HCMC basis), about US \$2-3/MT lower than prices of the last two weeks. Lack of import demand also makes prices down.

Unless increase in export sales are registered soon, prices will slump further as the W-S crop harvest in March fast approaches.

TRADE

Vietnam's 2000 rice export was 3.37 MMT, well below Government target.

According to Ministry of Trade, Vietnam's 2000 rice exports reached only 3.37 MMT, down 26% from 4.55 MMT of 1999. The main destinations for Vietnamese rice were still Asian and African countries. Iraq was the leading importer of Vietnam rice with a total of 685 TMT. The Philippines emerged to be the second biggest buyer taking 606 TMT. Vietnam rice exported to Indonesia in 2000 was only 50% of 1999's level. Tables 3, 4 & 5 present Vietnam's 2000 rice exports in November; December and for the whole year 2000 by grades and destinations.

Quality of Vietnam 's 2000 rice exports.

Forty two percent of Vietnam's rice exports was classified on the high grades (2%; 5% and 10% broken rice) while the rice exports on medium (15% broken rice) and low (25%, 35% and 100% broken rice) grades accounting 28% of each respectively.

Low rice exports in the first quarter of 2001.

In general, rice trade remains slow. The market for Vietnam rice continues to be quiet in the first quarter (Q1) of 2001 due to absence of major buyers. Low import demand from major importers i.e Indonesia, Philippines and African Countries has not supported export sales in the Q1 of 2001. Outstanding sales are only 220 TMT, mainly to Iraq and Cuba under Government to Government deals.

However, the pace of rice export in January 2001 is improving with estimated export volume of 150 TMT, a rise of 76% compared with the amount shipped on the same period of 2000 as a result of strong shipping to Iraq and Cuba.

Vietnam export campaign 2001 set at 4.0MMT.

The Post keeps our previous forecast for Vietnam rice export in 2001 at 4 MMT (see Table 6).

POLICY

The floor price for paddy will be set- up again?

Toprotectrice farmers, MARD's authorities in MRD are submitting to the GVN aproposal to set up again the floor price for 2001's paddy. The floor price of paddy is proposed at VND 1,500/kg (that was VND 1,650/kg in 1999).

Rice growing areas possibly to be reduced.

According to the MARD's master plan for ice production (based on the Decree No. 9 of the Government), about 100 Tha of paddy land will be shifted to fish and shimp farming. Fuit and other cops will replace paddy in some areas either near cities or under unfavorable inigation system. The areas of late S-A will be reduced by about 200 Tha. Improving crop yield will be given priority for increasing paddy output.

Vietnam sets agricultural development goals for 2001.

- **S** Agricultural growth rate: above 4%.
- **S** National output of food production: paddy production is set at 31.0- 31.5 MMT.
- **S** Agricultural export value: \$3.4 Billion (in which rice exports is set at 4.0 MMT.)
- **S** Forest plantation: plant an additional 200 Tha, improve forests on another 525 Tha
- **S** Budget spending of VND 1,444 Billion on inigation systems, and VND 170 Billion on research of new plant varieties (US \$1.00=VND 14,050, as of March 3, 2000, when budget was prepared).

Vietnam Rice Export Mechanism for 2001 still unclear.

The ice export mechanism of 2000 is extended to the end of March 2001 and new mechanism for 2001 probably will be applied in April. In principle, export management mechanism for rice will likely be more liberalized in 2001 and the private sector will probably g
