## **Report Highlights:**

On June 17, 2019, Japan notified the World Trade Organization of draft amendments to the maximum residue levels (MRL) for the veterinary drug, Fluralaner, via <u>G/SPS/N/JPN/656</u>. There will be no public comment period established for this proposal as this proposal relaxes the regulation. 1. "Edible offal" refers to all edible parts, except muscle, fat, liver, and kidney.
