SECTION I

Demographic Summary of the United Kingdom Jewish Population

UK Jewish Population

Until recently, it had been thought that the Jewish population in the United Kingdom had been declining by an average of 1 to 2 percent per year. However, recent indications show that for the first time since World War II, the UK Jewish population has started to increase once again. The UK Jewish population is currently estimated at 275,000 for 2007, up from 266,740 in 2003 (figures based on studies at Manchester and Leeds Universities).

London is the focal point of British Jewry today, as it has been throughout its history. London's Jewish population, approximately 219,000, accounts for two thirds of the total UK Jewish community.

Within the London metropolitan area (including the close-in suburbs), there are Jewish communities in the suburbs of Hendon, Golder's Green, Brent Cross, Finchley and Stamford Hill. There are also large communities in the outer London areas of Kenton, Edgware, Stanmore, Bushey, Borehamwood and Radlett.

Other areas of the UK with somewhat sizeable Jewish communities are: Manchester where there is a Jewish population of 30,000, Leeds with a population of 10,000, Liverpool – 4,000, Glasgow – 3,000 and Birmingham – 3,000.

Prospects for U.S. Kosher Products

Target Areas

If a U.S. exporter is intent on narrowly targeting the British Jewish community, the above demographic overview demonstrates that the largest market for U.S. kosher products in the UK lies predominately in the Northern London area. U.S. exporters are advised to visit this area and network with UK importers, retailers and foodservice operators — contacts are provided at the back of this report. Products that are not specifically ethnic can be marketed to the general population with the additional kosher niche.

Depending on a product's price, consumer appeal and competition, there are opportunities for U.S. kosher products in the small independent retailers as well as mainstream supermarkets. However, the number of small independent retailers has decreased over the years, particularly in communities outside Northern London. As more of the multiple supermarket chains have kosher food sections in their stores, a growing number of consumers find it easier, cheaper and more convenient to shop for kosher products at supermarkets.

Relationship with Importers

Most U.S. food and drink products are subject to import duty, therefore price is an important concern. For all avenues of distribution, it is beneficial to work through an importer who can assist with local food safety and labeling laws, and any other required trading standards legislation. UK supermarket chains are notoriously difficult to develop a relationship with; therefore, it is important to find an importer with the appropriate retail sector contacts to market your product.

Target Products

Given the rigorous EU requirements for meat imports and the very high tariffs on baked goods, the best prospects for U.S. products are quality shelf-stable products that are not yet available as kosher in the UK, or can compete on price or some other marketing advantage. The best chance for success is with a product that is desirable for the mainstream market as well as the kosher market.

In general, UK consumers of kosher products follow the mainstream UK consumer trends towards convenience products, healthy alternatives, organic products, specialty items and ethnic foods. As a result, there are market opportunities for snack foods, cookies, sauces, dips, breakfast cereals, soft drinks and other grocery items that would appeal to a sophisticated consumer. There is also a market for kosher wines, particularly for dry varieties that are showing more growth than the sweet dessert wines.

Opportunities also exist for U.S. products that can be specially formulated or designed to specifications, to meet taste requirements for the particular products. A number of Israeli manufacturers export these types of products to the UK.

SECTION II

KOSHER CERTIFICATION ACCEPTANCE/PREFERENCE

Certification, Product Labeling

Most major U.S. kosher certification symbols are accepted in the UK. Certification acceptance varies with the individual consumer, and local UK symbols have a stronger following. The main UK authorities are the London Beth Din; Kedassia; The Joint Kashrus Committee of England; The Federation of Synagogues Kashrus; and the Manchester Beth Din. Their

contact details are at the end of this report. The London Beth Din is one of the largest kosher certification agencies in Europe and Asia and is a leading authority on kosher food and Jewish law. The London Beth Din is very well known, encompassing licensing of over 100 restaurants, hotels and bakeries, as well as certification of almost 700 factories worldwide (<u>http://www.kosher.org.uk</u>).

Import Regulations

Kosher products are not subject to additional UK food laws that differ from their non-kosher counterparts. For further information, please see the FAS report covering UK import regulations and local labeling/ingredient law entitled, "Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards" (Report Number UK 7021 at http://www.fas.usda.gov/gainfiles/200108/120681479.pdf). Currently, U.S. poultry is not permitted to enter the EU and in general, it is difficult to export red meat, which requires EU certification. Products with a high sugar content and/or flour/starch content are subject to very high import duties, ranging between 30 and 70 percent.

SECTION III

CONSUMPTION AND MARKET SECTORS

Consumption

Profile of Kosher Food Consumer

Over the years the kosher food consumer has changed quite considerably. Until ten years ago, kosher food was on the whole, eaten only by members of the Jewish communities. Today, however, kosher food has a wider appeal. A number of consumers who are increasingly concerned about animal diseases are seeking kosher products, which they consider safer, healthier and better for them. Some consumers feel that kosher food products hold a higher mark of safety than non-kosher items.


Because more kosher products are found in mainstream supermarkets, consumers who are vegetarian, food sensitive or who are allergic to certain ingredients tend to buy certain kosher products due to their clear labeling and the separate designations of meat, dairy and parve products, for foods which contain no meat or dairy ingredients.

A publication called The Really Jewish Food Guide is published every two years and lists over 6,000 kosher products and stores in the UK where you can buy them. This may be a good resource for exporters to learn about the kosher food market.

Although trade sources are reporting that kosher foods have a broader appeal to consumers outside of the Jewish community, it must be said that only a small percentage of UK mainstream consumers actually look for kosher products when shopping for food.

Market Sectors

Figure I below illustrates the distribution system for food products from the United States to the UK market.



A. Retail

Stores

Many kosher products are sold at the retail level through small independent stores located in the heart of Jewish communities. These stores obtain their products from UK manufacturers, UK importers, or directly from the United States or a competitor country (such as Israel, a major kosher product supplier). Among the older generation, customer loyalty is strong and shopping preferences tend to be conservative. Their grocery shopping is done primarily at local neighborhood stores. Young, modern Jewish consumers who are kosher-observant are more likely to shop at a variety of shops and supermarkets, looking for exciting mainstream products now available as kosher.

The remaining kosher retail sales are through the large UK supermarkets. These are a considerable force in mainstream UK retailing with the top ten chains accounting for around 75 percent of all UK retail grocery sales. Major UK retail chains have a number of stores that include kosher food sections. To illustrate, Tesco - the UK's largest retailer - has 49 stores out of 1,252 nationwide with a dedicated kosher food section. However, in many of its other stores, kosher food products are sold alongside mainstream products. The location of stores that carry kosher product lines is determined by the demand of the local population.

U.S. kosher products have an advantage over most locally produced kosher products because they carry a distinct symbol (such as OU or OK) and, at this time, most local products do not have such a distinction.

Consumer Preference

UK retailers tend to experience an increase in ethnic kosher product sales during major Jewish holidays, particularly at Passover. This represents an opportunity for imports of U.S. kosher-for-Passover products.

Depending upon the product and the supplier's plans for that product, the supplier may lobby UK retailers to locate the product outside the dedicated kosher section. A portion of the UK population believes that kosher food is only to be eaten by Jews. Therefore, if the product has universal appeal, its sale may be limited if it is located only within the kosher section.

B. Hotel and Restaurant Industry (HRI) / Food Service

Catering, Restaurant Market

There is a small market for kosher meals in branches of UK foodservice. For most mainstream operators, preparing kosher products on-site is not cost-effective. Generally, kosher meals are brought in frozen from specialized suppliers. Frozen meals provided by licensed suppliers are usually in protective plastic or foil containers. They are labeled, taped with tamper-proof seals and coded with kosher license details that meet kosher, food hygiene and labeling regulations. These meals are supplied to hospitals, schools, restaurants and hotels for functions with kosher-observant guests.

There are approximately 25 kosher restaurants in the UK, with the majority located in London. To date, kosher restaurant food has not attracted large mainstream interest, possibly due to associated added costs to the consumer.

In addition, there is a significant kosher catering market in the UK. Currently, several kosher caterers provide meals for weddings, bar mitzvahs and other occasions, which are available in specific catering halls or hotels.

Sources of Opportunity

Opportunities for U.S. foodservice products and food ingredients for catering can be found through contact with the specialist kosher foodservice manufacturers shown in the HRI/Foodservice section at the end of this report and through contact with the UK kosher restaurants. However, it is common for these establishments to source products through UK importers, and so they remain the most important contacts to make.
