Report Highlights:

The exact size of the market for kosher products in South Africa is difficult to measure, but it is estimated that the consumption of Koshered products is substantial. About 80 percent of the Kosher products in the market are produced locally, while the remaining 20 percent is imported from the United States, Canada, Israel and EU. South African food regulation requires that imported Kosher products, like any other imported products comply with its Sanitary and Phytosanitary requirements. Major export market for South African Kosher products include the United States, Israel, Canada and Australia.

Summary

A variety of kosher products is consumed in South Africa by both Jewish and non-Jewish consumers. According to South African kosher trade sources, the size of the Jewish community is estimated at about 150,000, and consumption of kosher products is substantial. The main products consumed are; meat, fish, dairy products, soya products, baked goods and confectionery, chocolates, and sweets. The consumption trends are similar to the non-kosher market, and there are many products that are similar to non-kosher products. The Johannesburg Beth-Din kosher certification mark helps kosher consumers buy kosher products. In the absence of the "halaal" sign on products, the Muslim community will buy kosher products.

In addition to domestic production, kosher food products are imported. Eighty percent of the products are produced locally and 20 percent are imported, indicating a growing number of large local manufacturers that are having products certified as kosher. All imported kosher products need the kosher certification mark from the country of origin. Kosher food imports, like other food products, need to comply with South African sanitary and phytosanitary requirements. Numerous products have duties applied to them; but some important products such as matzo for Passover, and others, are exempt from duty.

South Africa exports kosher products to Israel, the United States, Australia, Canada, and other countries. The depreciating South African currency and strong domestic production are making it difficult for imported foodstuffs to be competitive in the South African market. However, this does not totally exclude imported kosher products from the local market.

South Africa does not have any kosher trade shows; U.S. producers can promote kosher product through direct communication with the Johannesburg Beth-Din, Kashrut Department. Also, trade missions could be organized for South African importers to visit the United States to meet with kosher product producers.

Domestic Production

Due to the demand for kosher foods, the number of local manufacturers is growing. Most of the food companies producing food for the regular market are also producing kosher products. The kosher trends are similar to those of the non-kosher market. The Johannesburg Beth-Din kosher certification mark helps consumers identify kosher products. Kosher products are produced in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Johannesburg Beth-Din, Kashrut Department, which also controls the packaging and labeling of the products. Locally produced kosher products include, milk, cottage cheese, yoghurt, spices, vinegar, sauces, salt, tea, coffee, instant coffee, porridge, biscuits, potato chips, sweets, chocolates, cocoa powder, ice cream, chocolate coating, jam, cake mixes, bread mixes, ice cream mixes, canned fruit, canned vegetables, pickles, and frozen fish.

Market Size

According to the Johannesburg Beth-Din, there are about 150, 000 Jews in South Africa. In addition, Muslim communities and some members of the general public consume kosher products that bear the Beth-Din certification. There is a growing demand for kosher products, including ready-prepared kosher meals for business lunches and dinners. These food products are on the menu of many top-grade hotels and game lodges in South Africa.

Consumption

According to local trade sources, South African supermarkets stock a large selection of products bearing the Beth-Din kosher certification mark. The certification is applicable to both locally produced and imported products. To ensure the quality and uniformity of products, kosher authorities are strict on locally produced kosher foods as well as imported products. Only products bearing the stickers with a Beth-Din sign are allowed.

In addition, details such as whether the product is dairy or pareve (containing neither dairy nor meat), the name of the producer, date, and internal control number sequence should be included on a sticker. Normal duties are applicable to kosher products, but some important products such as matzo for Passover and others are exempt from duties. The largest retailers of kosher foods are: Pick n Pay, Shoprite Checkers, Woolworths, and Spar chains as well as specialized outlets such as Thrupps.

Trade

According to the Johannesburg Beth-Din, South African supermarkets, distributors, importers, and manufacturers import kosher products mainly from the United States, Israel, Canada, the United Kingdom, and other European countries. Many of the locally produced kosher products are exported to Israel, the United States, Australia, and Canada.
