Mexico Announces New Labeling Requirements for

Avocados

Report Highlights:

The Government of Mexico has announced new labeling requirements for avocados, both imported and Mexican grown. Given that Mexico is a significant avocado producer, it imports very few avocados from the United States and therefore these new requirements will not significantly impact U.S. trade.

This report summarizes a Final Rule (*Norma*) published in Mexico's "*Diario Oficial*" (Federal Register)" on August 31, 1998.

Disclaimer: This summary is based on a *preliminary* review of the subject Agreement announcement and therefore should not, under any circumstances, be viewed as a definitive reading of the regulation in question, or of its implications for U.S. agricultural export trade interests. In the event of a discrepancy or discrepancies between this summary and the complete regulation or announcement as published in Spanish, the latter shall prevail.

FAS/Mexico's Executive Summary: This final rule states the labeling requirements for avocados, both imported and Mexican-grown. Because Mexico is a major avocado producer/exporter and therefore imports few avocados from the United States, FAS Mexico believes this regulation's impact on overall U.S. exports will be minimal.

Specific Label Requirements:

The label on the packing boxes should be in Spanish and must at least state the following:
 -Name and address of producer, packer or importer.
 -Generic Name: AGUACATE
 -Variety of the product
 -Grade (NMX-FF-016)
 -Total weight in kilograms
 -Country and region of origin

2) Labeling must be printed on packing box or on a glued label in the front face of the box.

3) If original product label is not in Spanish, the new label in Spanish with the complete information stated in this Norm has to be similar to the original label (size and typesetting).

4) Avocados graded "Extra" or "First" must have:¹
-Name and address of producer, packer or importer
-Grade of the product.
