Report Highlights:

Wet and relatively cool weather conditions, prevalent throughout most of Peninsular Spain since late March, have substantially improved prospects for the winter grain crop. Harvesting has begun in southern areas and good yields are reported. Prices for grains are declining dramatically and a higher use of grain in feed formulas is expected in MY 2004/05

Summary

Wet and relatively cool weather conditions, prevalent throughout most of Peninsular Spain since late February 2004, have substantially improved prospects for the 2004 winter grain crop. Consequently, the 2004/05 production forecasts for wheat, barley, and other small grains have been increased. Prices for feed wheat and barley for July/December 2004 are in general about 20 percent lower than a year earlier levels. Under these prices conditions, grain consumption is expected to rise in MY 2004/05. For rice and corn, planting and emergence is reportedly progressing without problems; producers expect a record output of rice.

Current forecasts for 2004/05 grain crops are presented below:

Durum: Abundant rains and relatively low temperatures resulted in a delay in harvesting both durum and barley in the south. According to trade sources, harvesting began in the first week of June. For durum, a record crop is expected; however, heavy rains in May hurt the quality of the durum crop in some areas. According to trade sources, vitreous contents are low and some kernels have been affected by fungus. Much of this lower quality durum will go into feeds. The good crop expected in North Africa will likely hamper exports of Spanish durum.

BARLEY: The recent rains and unseasonably cool temperatures have improved prospects for the barley crop. As a result, the production forecast was raised to 10.8 million tons. Most of the crop will be consumed domestically, although some may be exported to Portugal. Barley prices have been declining steadily since April.
