Export prices for white and parboiled rice increased by 2-3 percent from the previous week as demand from African markets remained strong. Thai baht also appreciated against the U.S. dollar to 31.03 baht/U.S. \$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 31.31 baht/U.S. \$1.00. According to Thai Meteorological Department, the rainy season is expected to begin around the second week of May and will last until mid-October, with precipitation expected to be 5-10 percent above normal. On Tuesday, April 27, 2021, the Thai cabinet approved reducing the surcharge rice exporters pay to export rice to the European Union and the United Kingdom from 2,500 baht per ton to 1,500 baht per ton and 1,200 baht per ton, respectively, to boost the competitiveness of Thai rice in those markets.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for April 26 – May 2, 2021, totaled 19,314 metric tons, down 45,161 metric tons from the previous week and down 13,799 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 33,113 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – May 2, 2021, totaled 936,052 metric tons, down 34 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013 and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
