Export prices of most grades of rice decreased 1-2 percent from the previous week despite the strengthening of the Thai baht to 32.64 baht/\$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 33.27 baht/\$1.00. South Africa was the most active market for parboiled rice and Saudi Arabia for fragrant rice exports this past week. Domestic white and parboiled rice prices declined 2 percent from the previous week and are down 10-12 percent from the same period last year. Rice exporters expect that container shortages and high freight costs will continue until the first quarter of 2022. The Thai Meteorological Department (TMD) announced that winter began on November 2, 2021, and expects that the amount of rain and its intensity will decrease for most parts of the country. Reservoir levels in the northern region and the central plains totaled 8,019 million cubic meters on November 9, 2021, up 34 percent from last year. MY2021/22 off-season rice planting has already begun in some areas where flood waters have receded.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for October 25-31, 2021, totaled 114,884 metric tons, down 7,311 metric tons from the previous week and down 2,492 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 117,376 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1- October 31,2021, totaled 3,700,062 metric tons, up 6 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
