Export prices of most grades of rice increased 1-2 percent from the previous week due to the strengthening of the Thai baht to 32.57 baht/\$1.00 from the previous week's exchange rate of 32.64 baht/\$1.00. Trade activities for Thai rice are quiet as traders are waiting until supplies of new-crop rice enter the market next month. The Bank of Agriculture and Cooperatives (BACC) began providing compensation to farmers under the 2021/22 paddy rice price guarantee scheme. The latest payment, approved on November 12, 2021, provides glutinous rice farmers with the highest compensation as market prices were 4,328.50 baht/ton (\$133/ton) lower than guaranteed prices. Rice farmers can receive a maximum compensation of 69,256 baht (\$2,126) per household.

Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for November 1-7, 2021, totaled 111,144 metric tons, down 3,740 metric tons from the previous week and down 9,757 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 120,901 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – November 7, 2021, totaled 3,811,207 metric tons, up 5 percent from the same period last year.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013, and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
