Export prices for all grades of rice decreased around one percent from the previous week. There are fewer new inquiries due to concerns about high freight costs. Additionally, the Thai baht remains strong at 31.02 baht/U.S. \$1.00 compared to the previous week's exchange rate of 31.04 baht/U.S. \$1.00.

Around 34 percent of MY2021/22 main-crop rice has been planted, particularly in the lower northern region and the central plains, totaling approximately 5.6 million rai (895,225 hectare). Although main-crop rice planting started off early this year, some areas are experiencing low to no rain during the early stages of planting.

## Rice Export Update

Unofficial and preliminary rice exports (excluding Hom Mali fragrant rice) for May 31 – June 6, 2021, totaled 27,234 metric tons, down 24,992 metric tons from the previous week and down 28,916 metric tons from the four-week moving average of 56,150 metric tons (Table 2). Rice exports from January 1 – June 6, 2021, totaled 1,335,199 metric tons, down 27 percent from the same period last year.

**Note on data:** Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. In addition, between May 1, 2013 and December 18, 2016, export data did not include 25% -100% grade white rice exports as the reporting authority was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official export data. FAS/BKK reports only the official export numbers available from the Board of Trade of Thailand. The reader should bear in mind these differences when comparing historical data with current data.
