Report Highlights:

Egyptian rice exports increased substantially during the first three months of 2003. Based on an optimistic forecast for the new crop, rough rice prices are expected to be down.

Since the beginning of CY 2003, (Jan, 2003) Egypt exported 178,553 MT of rice, up from 98,125 MT during the same period of CY 2002. There are two reasons for this substantial increase in rice exports during the first three months of the CY 2003. First, the devaluation of the Egyptian pound made Egyptian rice export prices more competitive, and second, less exportable surplus of U.S rice. According to Egyptian rice traders, current export price for short grain varieties is \$ 240 per MT /FOB and \$350 per MT/FOB for medium grain varieties, compared to about \$ 430 per MT/ FOB for U.S rice. Based on the optimistic forecast for the new crop, rough rice prices are expected to be down compared to last year.
