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Report Highlights: The Czech Republic does not produce any rice and the main supplying countries are Viet Nam, Italy and Thailand. Total annual rice consumption is between 50,000 and 60,000 metric tons (MT). According to official statistics, the U.S. share of rice imports last year was only 2.1 percent but unreported transhipments from European brokers likely means that the U.S. share is closer to 10 percent. Rice is a well established food in the Czech Republic and consumption is stable at about 4.5 kilograms per capita. The most popular variety is non parboiled long grain rice. U.S. export opportunities should for rice should grow after the Czech Republic joins the EU, perhaps as early as 2004.

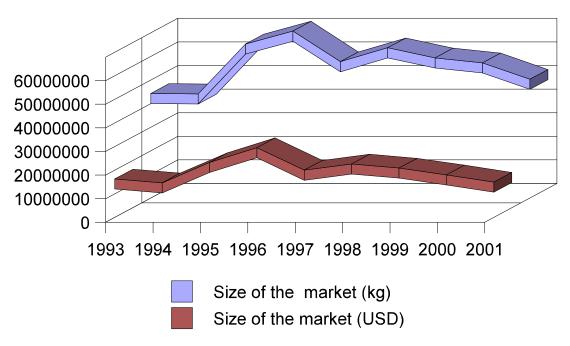

MARKET SECTOR

The size of the Czech rice market has not dramatically changed in last ten years but U.S. exports have been replaced by shipments from Viet Nam and Italy.

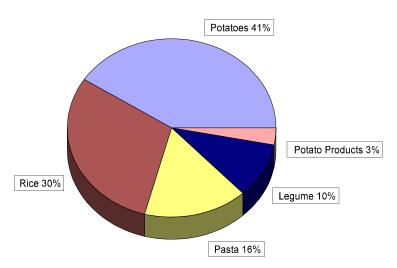
Trends

There are about ten large firms that distribute rice in the Czech Republic - three of these are also importers. All of the companies offer very similar varieties.

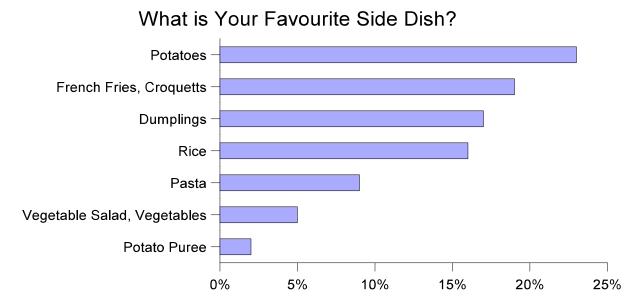
These companies have in the past tried producing or importing dry ready-to-eat rice meals but have so far been unsuccessful. For example an imported rice pilaf mix by Uncle Ben's sold in Tesco stores and cost about \$2 per package. The general view is that this product was overpriced for the market. Several Czech companies also tried producing dried rice meals with imported bulk rice. Even though the prices of these products were lower they have were not as successful as ready to eat pasta and other similar products in the 'ready to eat' category.

Rice in the Czech Republic is not usually eaten as a main dish but it is a popular side dish.

The 'side dish' market is as follows:



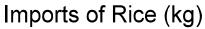

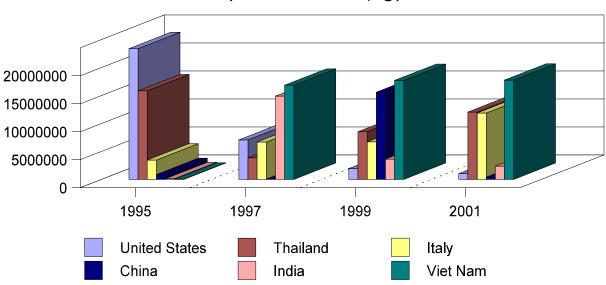
Import Statistics

The United States has lost market share since 1995. This is due to low priced competition from south east Asian suppliers (Viet Nam) and from subsidized EU exports (mostly Italy). In the future, when the Czech Republic is an EU member, there may be more opportunities for U.S. suppliers. The current EU tariff system favors higher priced rice imports and EU export subsidies will no longer be an issue.

Due to difference in the U.S. and Czech HTS categories, trade statistics for basmati and long/medium/short grain rice is not available.

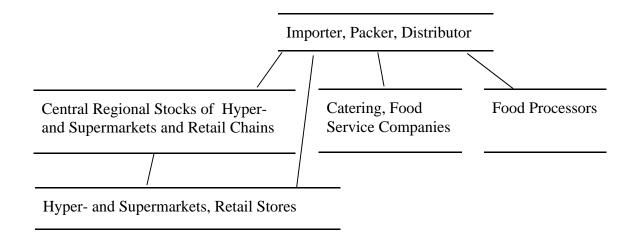

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Entry Strategy

Most of imported rice is packaged within the country and is usually done by the importer. From the importer the rice goes directly for sale in hypermarkets or to regional central distribution hubs for food retail chains. The whole structure of distribution channel may be drawn as follows:



Pricing

The wholesale prices of rice are approximately following (VAT 5 percent not included):

dg = 0.5 USD
1 kg 0.6 USD
g 0.65 USD
g 0.68 USD
5 kg 0.4 USD
25 kg 0.82 USD
0.5 kg 0.93 USD
kg 1.2 USD
5 kg 1.35 USD
5 kg 0.7 USD

Retailers usually add a 20 to 25 percent margin to the wholesale price.

MARKET ACCESS

Import barriers, Taxes, Duties

There are no duties or quotas on rice imported to the Czech Republic and there are no known non tariff barriers. There is 5 percent VAT on rice. U.S. suppliers do face price competition from subsidized EU suppliers of rice.

Labeling, Packaging, Certification

- no special import certificates are needed
- there are no special packaging requirements
- labeling should provide following information according to the § 6 Food law no. 110 (1997) regulation no. 333:

T name of producer/processor/importer/distributor

T name of product, kind, grade

T quantity or net weight

T expiration date

T nutrition facts

T cooking instructions/instructions of use

T storage conditions

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
