Report Highlights:

On July 3, 2020, Poland's Chief Veterinary Officer (CVO) officially notified an African swine fever (ASF) outbreak on a 122-head hog farm in the Warmia and Mazury Province in northeastern Poland. The affected herd consisted of ten sows, 27 piglets, one boar, and 84 other pigs. Veterinary authorities implemented protection and surveillance procedures to contain the outbreak. This outbreak is Poland's sixth commercial ASF outbreak in 2020.

General Information

On July 3, 2020, Poland's CVO announced that the National Veterinary Research Institute in Puławy confirmed the sixth commercial ASF outbreak of 2020 on a 122-head hog farm. The farm is located in Olecko County in the Warmia and Mazury Province in northeastern Poland. The affected herd consisted of ten sows, 27 piglets, one boar, and 84 other pigs. Veterinary authorities implemented all procedures to contain and control the outbreak by establishing protected and surveillance zones around the farm and in the immediate area. The farm is located within a previously established restriction zone under Poland's regionalization plan, as per Part III of the Annex of the Commission Decision 2014/709/EU.
