Report Highlights:

On August 28, 2020, Taiwan announced that, beginning January 1, 2021, it will no longer restrict imports of U.S. beef to cattle of less than 30 months of age. This report contains an unofficial English translation of TFDA's draft regulation, as well as Taiwan's notification of the measure to the WTO SPS Commitee.

THIS REPORT CONTAINS ASSESSMENTS OF COMMODITY AND TRADE ISSUES MADE BY USDA STAFF AND NOT NECESSARILY STATEMENTS OF OFFICIAL U.S. GOVERNMENT POLICY On August 28, 2020, President Tsai Ing-Wen announced that Taiwan would no longer restrict U.S. beef imports to beef from cattle aged 30 months or younger. Beginning January 1, 2021, Taiwan will allow imports of U.S. beef from cattle of any age. On September 7, the Taiwan Food and Drug Administration (TFDA) published a draft regulation for this change. The regulation applies to the same muscle cuts which are currently allowed in LT30-verified beef. Offals and ground beef from U.S. cattle of any age remain restricted. Attached to this report is an unofficial English translation the TFDA draft regulation.
