### **Tobacco Unmfg**

### Production

No local production of leaf tobacco.

### Trade

Of the 17,700 metric tons of leaf tobacco imported in Singapore, it is estimated that about a third or 6,200 metric tons were retained for the manufacture of cigarettes. The remaining 11,500 metric tons were re-exported to neighboring countries. Unfortunately this re-export figure is not fully reflected in the official statistics.

Major suppliers of leaf tobacco for the two cigarette manufacturing plants in Singapore in 1998 were U.S., Brazil, China and Zimbabwe. Smaller volumes were also sourced from Greece, India and the Philippines. Most of the cigarette production were shipped to China and Vietnam, markets which demand low price and lower grade quality tobacco products.

As more countries are gradually increasing their cigarette production capabilities, contract manufacturing by the Singapore plants will continue to decline.

### **Tobacco Mfg, Cigarettes**

### Production

Singapore currently has two cigarette plants, one operated by British-American-Tobacco (BAT) and the other by Rothmans. Total output of the two plants have been estimated at 6,200 metric tons for calendar year 1998.

BAT, the larger of the two plants, and whose annual output ranges between 5,000 - 6,000 metric tons per year will cease operations by end April 1999.

BAT will continue to distribute cigarettes imported from U.K. and the U.S. The main brands currently distributed by BAT are Lucky Strike and Kent from the U.S. and State Express 555 and Bensons from the United Kingdom.

#### Merger

With the announced takeover of Rothmans by BAT, both companies in Singapore will rationalize distribution and marketing efforts. There will be some economies to be achieved by rationalizing distribution vehicles and combining the sales teams of the two organizations.

#### Trade

Singapore has been a major transshipment center for cigarettes for more than two decades. Re-exports of cigarettes which are about twenty times greater than local consumption are destined for a wide number of countries including China, Hong Kong, Vietnam, Russia, Cambodia, Qatar and India. In 1998, re-exports fell by about 10 percent compared to 1997 partly because of the recession in neighboring countries and partly by imposition of new restrictions on imports by the authorities in Myanmar.

### Tariffs

The Singapore authorities raised excise duties on cigarettes by S\$15 per kilo in February 1998 bringing the new excise duty to S\$130 per kilo (US\$76.02). In response to the new excise taxes, cigarettes prices were raised by 20 cents Singapore per pack of 20s in November 1998.

#### **Market Share**

Philip Morris has steadily increased its market share in Singapore over the last five years. Its Marlboro brand alone accounts for about half of the Singapore domestic market. As a result, market shares by the other three cigarette companies have fallen.

The breakdown of market shares by companies are as follows:
