Report Highlights:

Ukraine established a 24 million metric ton (MMT) export cap for corn for the marketing year (MY)2020/21.

According to information available to Post, the Ministry of Economic Development Trade and Agriculture (MEDTA) and a number of NGOs representing interests of both Ukrainian and international businesses signed the Addendum to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on January 3, 2021.

The MOU Addendum sets a 24 MMT export threshold for corn exports for the local MY2020/21. *Post's note: the Ukrainian MY for all grains (including coarse grains) is set as July-June. There is a high probability that remaining corn stocks could be freely exported during the period July to September before the conclusion of the standardized MY2020/21 (October-September)*. The recent signing of the MOU Addendum concludes the establishment of export caps across all major grains (except for barley). In August 2020, MEDTA announced (<u>in Ukrainian</u>) MY2020/21 exportable volumes for wheat -17.5 MMT and rye -1 thousand MT.

According to publicly available information, four national NGOs representing animal (poultry, pig, and cattle producers) and feed producers initiated a lobbying campaign requesting that the Government of Ukraine (GOU) introduce export limits for corn (<u>in Ukrainian</u>). Their major concern was increasing feed grain prices that would have a direct impact on the profitability of their businesses.

Based on the corn exportable volume reflected in the MOU Addendum, FAS Kyiv has revised PSD (Production Supply and Distribution) tables for wheat, barley and corn compared to the ones included in our previous <u>GAIN Report UP2021-0003</u>.

FAS Kyiv anticipates that the export cap may result in a reshuffling of the feed consumption structure. Corn will substitute both wheat and barley in animal rations, please refer to the updated Estimated Feed Consumption table below for more details.

Clamping down on corn exports, would allow higher MY2020/21 wheat and barley exports compared to Post's previous estimates. The adjusted MY2020/21 estimates include:

- MY Exports: barley 4.2 MMT, corn 24 MMT and wheat 17.5 MMT;
- Feed and Residual: barley -2.6 MMT, corn -6.4 MMT and wheat -1.2 MMT.
