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## **Report Highlights:**

Mexico has updated its organic products law (LPO by its Spanish acronym) enforcement notification to the World Trade Organization (WTO) from the Committee on Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Measures to the Committee on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT). Trading partners and domestic/international stakeholders are encouraged to submit comments to Mexico on this notification within 60 days of June 28, 2021. U.S. exporters of organic products to Mexico are reminded bulk/raw material, as well as processed products, are subject to enforcement of the LPO and other applicable Mexican laws.

Since <u>publishing changes in December 2020</u> to its import procedures for organic product imports under the Organic Products Law (LPO by its Spanish acronym), Mexico has notified <u>the Measure</u> first to the World Trade Organization's Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Committee under "<u>G/SPS/N/MEX/230/Add.3</u>" and now to the Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) Committee under "<u>G/TBT/N/MEX/497</u>". Trading partners and domestic/international stakeholders are encouraged to submit comments to Mexico on this notification within 60 days of June 28, 2021.

A professional translation of the Measure and background information can be found in FAS GAIN MX2021-0023. U.S. exporters and certifiers of organic products – raw/bulk material as well as processed – who intend to commercialize their product as organic in Mexico are reminded of their responsibility to comply with Mexican laws.

- 6. Description of content: On 26 December 2020, the Decision amending the decision establishing the goods the import of which is subject to regulation by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, and the issuance of the certificate of origin for exporting coffee, Article 7 of which sets out the requirements to be submitted by importers at the point of entry in the country, with regard to goods entering the country that are described or labelled as "organic", "biological" or "ecological", or with the prefix "bio" or "eco", listed in subparagraphs (b) to (f) of Annex I of the Decision, was published in the Official Journal.
  - In light of the challenges of the pandemic faced at the global level, the need for certification and the ongoing equivalence discussions with other countries, it is necessary to amend the Fourth Transitional Article of the aforementioned Decision, to maintain exports of organic products from other countries to Mexico, maintain the trade flow and strengthen the development of the domestic production sector, and to facilitate and sustain trade in organic agricultural products of countries in the process of negotiating

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equivalence agreements with the Mexican Government, to support those involved in the organic product chain. Consequently, the Fourth Transitional Article of the Decision establishing the goods the import of which is subject to regulation by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, and the issuance of the certificate of origin for exporting coffee, published in the Official Journal on 26 December 2020, has been amended and reads as follows: "FOURTH.- The provisions of Article 7 shall enter into force as from 1 January 2022."
