Despite the Government's stock release, domestic and export prices continue to increase due to aggressive loading activities and the strengthening Thai baht.

Market Tone

Alongside intense loading activities, domestic and export prices surged despite the government's November 8 announcement to release 2004/05 – 2005/06 white rice and fragrant rice intervention stocks. The Government released 888,323 tons out of the last couple of tenders totalling 913,347 tons. Around 570,000 tons are for export, of which 370,137 tons are white rice (269,219 tons for 5% grade white rice and 100,918 tons for 25% grade white rice), with the balance being fragrant rice. Meanwhile, exporters are aggressively fulfilling outstanding shipments of white rice to Asian countries, particularly to the Philippines and Indonesia under the Government-to-Government contracts. Deliveries to these countries are expected to be completed by the middle of next month. However, domestic prices of white rice will likely remain strong as millers are currently sourcing white rice paddy for parboiled rice production for next year delivery (February). Also, the Indian non-basmati rice export ban should keep foreign demand for Thai rice high.

In addition, the Thai baht strengthened to 33.75 baht/\$U.S., as compared to 33.8 baht/\$U.S. in the previous week. Some exporters based their quotations on 33.0 - 33.5 baht/\$U.S.

Note on data: Export figures since March 22, 2002, do not include fragrant rice. The authority to report fragrant rice exports was moved from the Thai Board of Trade to the Ministry of Commerce's Office of Commodity Standards, which does not release official fragrant rice export data. FAS/BKK will report only official export numbers from the Board of Trade for non-fragrant and from the Office of Commodity Standards for fragrant rice when available, but the reader should bear in mind the difference between the data.

Unofficial exports (excluding fragrant rice) for Nov. 5-11, 2007 totaled 202,346 tons, up 5,679 tons from the previous week's total, and up 2,599 tons from the four-week moving average of 199,746 tons. Export during Jan. 1 – Nov. 11, 2007 totaled 5,252,370 tons, as compared with 4,241,734 tons in the previous year.

According to the Department of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce, total rice exports (including fragrant rice) during Jan. 1 – Nov. 7, 2007, amounted to 7,526,496 tons, up 19 percent from 6,311,942 tons in the previous year.
