### **Report Highlights:**

This weekly report contains data on rice prices in the U.S., Thailand and the EU. It also lists current import duties and export subsidies in the EU. All information will be published as such in the weekly USDA publication "Rice Market News".

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Weekly rice report - BRUSSELS, November 9, 1999

#### (1) MARKET SUMMARY

In the United States, the prices of brown rice decreased slightly, with end December being the first possible shipment date on new contracts. Parboiled brown rice continues to strengthen in price, this week's price increase being triggered by substantial demand from South Africa.

In Thailand, domestic prices remained nearly constant, notwithstanding the strengthening of the Baht against the U.S. dollar. Availabilities of new crop supplies seem to be lower than originally expected, caused in part by bad weather conditions.

The second week of bidding under the free market tenders for exports of EU rice showed a different picture than in the first round. A higher percentage of bids was awarded (5,360 MT out of 15,060 MT), but the average subsidy level went down. This week saw the first awards of export licenses for brown LG rice to Reunion. On the domestic markets, prices for LG rice have strengthened a little from last week. The selling pressure typically seen immediately after new crop supplies are available, is gradually diminishing. Current domestic market prices are, however, still below last year's levels.

- 3) Wholly milled MG and LG A rice to Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Poland, and Slovenia, Comm. Reg 2178/1999: 1,400 MT of bids, licenses awarded for 50 MT at a maximum export subsidy of EUR 120/MT.
- 4) Wholly milled MG and LG A rice to Zones I to VI (excl. East Europe) and Zone VIII (excluding Guyana, Madagascar and Surinam), Comm. Reg.2179/1999: 2,750 MT of bids, licenses awarded for 200 MT at a maximum export subsidy of EUR 107/MT.
- 5) Wholly milled RG rice to Zones I to VI (excl. Turkey) and Zone VIII (excluding Guyana, Madagascar and Surinam), Comm. Reg.2180/1999: 2,050 MT of bids, licenses awarded for 50 MT at a maximum export subsidy of EUR 98/MT.
