Report Highlights:

This weekly report contains data on rice prices in the U.S., Thailand and the EU. It also lists current import duties and export subsidies in the EU. All information will be published as such in the weekly USDA publication "Rice Market News".

Weekly rice report - BRUSSELS, January 12, 1999

(1) MARKET SUMMARY

Rice markets around the world still have not quoted substantially different prices from a couple of weeks ago. U.S. exporters have closed sales contracts with EU importers under the first quarter tranche of the 1999 rice TRQ, which will account for a large part of future shipments to the EU. In muslim countries, rice business will only fall back to normal levels in about a week from today, when Ramadan ends.

Effective January 7, 1999 new import duties were fixed according to the new calculation method set out in EU Commission Regulation 2831/98. The calculation of import duties for brown Indica rice continues to use US long grain 2/4/73 and US long grain parboiled 1/4/88 as reference qualities for establishing the import reference prices. The prices relating to these two reference qualities were, however, increased by 8%, which for the duties effective January 7, translated into a duty decrease of EUR 25/MT.

The EU grain management committee held its first 1999 meeting on January 7. Although EU exporters are interested in exporting more rice under free market export tenders (see volume of bids below), the European Commission cut off export subsidies at levels far below the levels bid for by exporters. In the meantime, discussions are going on within the respective EU management committees with regard to the administrative arrangements for the first consignments of food aid to Russia. For rice, the first tranch currently being envisaged consists of 15,000 MT (out of the total of 50,000 MT), which will be supplied from Spanish, Greek and Italian intervention stocks.

Reg. 2564/98: 6,015 MT of bids, licenses awarded for 195 MT at a maximum export subsidy of EUR 100/MT.
- Wholly milled round, medium and long grain A rice to Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Poland and Slovenia (Comm. Reg. 2565/98): 5,420 MT of bids, licenses awarded for 470 MT at a maximum export subsidy of EUR 104/MT.
- Wholly milled long grain rice to zones I to VI (except Turkey) and zone VIII (except Guyana, Madagascar and Surinam) (Comm. Reg. 2566/98): 4,100 MT of bids, licenses awarded for 1,600 MT at a maximum export subsidy of EUR 309/MT.
