Wheat PS&D Update

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Report Highlights: In MY 1999/00, Korea imported 3.8 million metric tons (MMT) of wheat, composed of 2.5 MMT of milling wheat and 1.3MMT of feed wheat. U.S. exports were at 1.5 MMT, composed of 1.35 MMT of milling wheat and 0.15 MMT of feed wheat. In MY 2000/01, Korea's wheat imports are forecast at 3.6, similar to last year's level. Current feed wheat prices are higher than corn, however, Korean feed millers expect feed wheat imports from the EU to be more competitive for the coming marketing year.

Includes PSD changes: Yes Includes Trade Matrix: Yes Unscheduled Report Seoul [KS1], KS In MY2000/01, Korea's wheat imports are forecast at 3.6 million metric tons (MMT), similar to last year's level. U.S. exports to Korea are forecast at 1.4 MMT, unchanged from the previous forecast. Feed wheat imports are expected to be variable dependent upon price fluctuations. Current feed wheat prices are about US\$110/MT on C&F basis, higher than corn prices at US\$100/MT from China and US\$105/MT from the United States. Korean feed millers expect feed wheat imports to be more competitive for the coming marketing year. Heavy rains during the wheat harvest in Europe reportedly caused increases in the supply of feed grade wheat. The expectation of increased feed wheat supplies from the EU is expected to cause some shifting out of corn.

In MY 1999/00, the total amount of wheat imports was 3.8 MMT, composed of 2.5MMT of milling wheat and 1.3MMT of feed wheat. U.S. exports were at 1.5 MMT, composed of 1.35 MMT of milling wheat and 0.15 MMT of feed wheat. Milling wheat imports increased over MY1998/99 on continuous strong demand in the instant noodle sector and increased demand out of the confectionary and bakery sectors as they recovered from the 1998 economic downturn. However, the U.S. milling wheat market share declined 6 percent, to 54 percent, as noodle producers sourced larger quantities of the Australian Standard White Wheat. Feed wheat imports totaled only 1.3 MMT in MY1999/00, a decrease of 47 percent over the prior year due to a sharp decrease of feed wheat supply from East Europe.
