## Thai Government Adopts Additional Price Support Measures for Rice

On October 1, 2009, the Thai Government replaced its rice mortgage scheme for a price insurance scheme (TH 9112). However due to price declines, on October 20 the government implemented additional measures, including the direct purchase of 2.0 million tons of paddy from farmers at benchmark prices and an on-farm mortgage scheme of 1.5 million ton of paddy.

#### MARKET ACCESS UPDATE

### Final Import Protocol for U.S. Seed Potatoes to Thailand

On October 13, 2009, the Thai Department of Agriculture approved a new import protocol for U.S. seed potatoes. The protocol is the result of an audit conducted by Thai officials on U.S. production areas and seed certification procedures in August, 2009. Under this protocol, seed potatoes must originate from California, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington. See TH9115 for more information.

## Thailand's Soybean Quota Allocation Process on Track

Sources in the Ministry of Commerce reported that the 2010 soybean TRQ was reviewed by the Committee on Soybeans and Soybean Oil in early October. The proposal is likely to be submitted for Cabinet approval in early November. If approved the Commerce Minister will announce the quota allocation sometime in late November-early December.
