Taiwan FDA Will Require Health Certificates for Eggs and Gelatins

Report Categories:

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Report Highlights:

Starting August 1, 2019, the Taiwan Food and Drug Administration (TFDA) will require health certificates for eggs and egg products, and gelatin and its derivatives intended for food use. U.S. exporters are advised to plan and obtain the required certificates for shipments departing from the United States on or after August 1, 2019.

General Information:

Certificates for Eggs and Egg Products for Food Use

On May 20, 2019, TFDA announced that they will require a certificate for eggs and egg products for food use effective August 1, 2019. The certificates must be issued by the competent authorities in exporting countries, and carry an attestation that the eggs and egg products are suitable for human consumption and in compliance with relevant food safety and sanitary regulations.

This requirement will apply to the eggs and egg products covered under harmonized system (HS) codes 0407, 0408, 350211 and 350219, please refer to Table 1 for the product description of each HS code, and the corresponding certificate. The existing certification requirement for these products remains unchanged, as described in the Taiwan Food and Agricultural Import Regulations and Standards Export Certificate Report. U.S. exporters will need to plan and obtain additional certificates as described in Table 1 for shipments departing from the United States on or after August 1, 2019.

To facilitate the shipment clearance in Taiwan, it is highly recommended that U.S. exporters work with their Taiwan importer to assure that the appropriate certificates are obtained and have complete information meeting TFDA's requirements.

Note:

- 1. For egg products certified by FSIS, the certificate can be issued for chicken, turkey, duck, geese, and guinea egg products.
- 2. For egg products certified by AMS, the certificate can be issued for chicken products.
- 3. For HS codes 0407.21.00.00-4, 0407.90.00.00-0 and 0408.99.90.00-1, currently Taiwan's Bureau of Animal and Plant Health Inspection and Quarantine (BAPHIQ) is already requiring AMS LPS-210S or AMS LPS-234. After August 1, 2019, the egg shipment will need to provide two original certificates of AMS LPS-210S, or one original certificate and one embossed copy of AMS LPS-234, for BAPHIQ and TFDA's inspection.

Certificates for Gelatin and its Derivatives for Food Use

On May 23, 2019, TFDA announced that they will require a certificate for gelatin and its derivatives for food use effective August 1, 2019. The certificates must be issued by the competent authorities in exporting countries, and carry an attestation that gelatin and its derivatives for food use are suitable for human consumption and in compliance with relevant food safety and sanitary regulations. In addition, the certificates should include information on the parts or tissues of the raw materials used, for example bovine skin.

This requirement will apply to gelatin and its derivatives covered under HS Codes 3503.00.10.00-4, 3503.00.20.00-2 and 3503.00.90.90-8. U.S. exporters will need to plan and obtain a health certificate issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for shipments departing from the United States on or after August 1, 2019.

To facilitate the shipment clearance in Taiwan, it is highly recommended that U.S. exporters work with

their Taiwan importer to assure that the appropriate certificates are obtained and have complete information meeting TFDA's requirements.
