

Sugar: World Markets and Trade

Record Global Production Keeps Consumption Near Record High



Global production for Marketing Year (MY) 2017/18 is up 9 million tons (raw value) to a record 180 million on gains in Brazil, China, the European Union, India, and Thailand. Despite record production, stocks are down 2 percent to 38 million tons as lower stocks in China and Mexico more than offset higher stocks in Pakistan. This drawdown, plus record exports, will support relatively flat consumption at 172 million tons.

In the *Changes to Sugar Market Coverage* section is a list of countries that will no longer be maintained in the PSD database beginning with the 2017/18 forecast. Using a 5-year average, dropping these countries lowers 2017/18 production (0.5 percent), imports (2.2 percent), and consumption (1.2 percent).

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2017/18 Sugar Overview


United States' production is forecast up slightly to 7.9 million tons. Imports are expected to jump 662,000 tons to a record 3.5 million based on projected quota programs and the calculation of U.S. Needs, as defined in the antidumping and countervailing duties suspension agreements effective December 2014. Consumption and stocks are both forecast up slightly.

Australia's production is forecast down 300,000 tons to 4.8 million. Harvesting has been slowed by cyclone-twisted and fallen sugar cane, as well as by high mud and debris levels. However, two factors make it difficult to assess the full impact of the cyclone: a large portion of the sugar cane that was not broken by strong winds or that was flooded for only short periods could recover, and undamaged sugar cane could benefit from increased soil moisture. Exports are expected down at 3.7 million tons on lower exportable supplies.

Brazil's production is forecast to rise 500,000 tons to a record 39.7 million on favorable weather and a 1-percent increase in sugarcane being diverted towards sugar production instead of ethanol. Exports are projected up 500,000 tons to a record 28.7 million on greater exportable supplies. Stocks are forecast up slightly while consumption is relatively unchanged.

China's production is forecast to rise 1.0 million tons to 10.5 million, due to an expected boost in area while high stocks limit greater expansion. After reaching 10.4 million tons 3 years ago, ending stocks continue to be drawn down. This drawdown in stocks, together with larger production and flat consumption, will lower imports.

There is, however, a great deal of uncertainty in the market because of a safeguard investigation into sugar imports being conducted by




China's Ministry of Commerce. This investigation was initiated in late September 2016 with the results scheduled to be announced May 22, 2017. As China is a huge sugar importer, the results of this investigation, and any possible resulting changes in import policy, could have a major impact not just on imports, but also on prices, production, and stock policies in China.

Note: Estimates for China's ending stocks and consumption between MY 2013/14 to 2016/17 have been revised, resulting in a significantly higher stock estimates.

Guatemala's production is forecast up 100,000 tons to a record 2.9 million on higher sugar recovery rates. Over the past 30 years, production increased at twice the pace of area expansion due to either increased cane yields in the field and/or higher recovery rates at the mill. With little land left for sugarcane expansion, higher production is mostly driven by improved sugar recovery rates. Exports are forecast flat at 2.1 million tons.

Production in the **European Union** is forecast to expand 2.1 million tons to a record 18.6 million on higher area and yields. Exports are forecast to rise nearly 50 percent to 2.2 million tons while imports are down over one-third. Consumption is projected down slightly to 18.7 million tons.

MY 2017/18 is the first year that the EU sugar market will function without the production quota regime and export limits. Production and export restrictions will be lifted as part of the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) reform, and European sugar groups will be able to produce and export as much as they want. The isoglucose industry will also be liberated from the production restrictions of the EU quota system. For the EU sugar refining sector, new market opportunities may open



up, although it will continue to face restrictions from high import tariffs, fixed import quotas, and decreasing preferential sugar import supplies. As a consequence, the EU sweetener market enters a new era with likely increased market volatility for the next few years until the various industries find new market equilibrium.

India's production is forecast to rebound by 18 percent to 25.8 million tons due to higher area and yields. Imports are forecast lower while consumption is forecast to edge higher to 26.0 million tons.

Mexico's production is forecast slightly higher at 6.6 million tons. However, exports are projected to soar 80 percent to 2.1 million tons as market access to the United States is projected to nearly double, in line with the terms of the suspension agreements signed between the U.S. Department of Commerce and the Mexican counterparts in December 2014. Stocks are slashed amid the jump in exports and a slight increase in consumption.

Pakistan's production is forecast up slightly to a record 6.0 million tons. Consumption is forecast up 200,000 tons, but stocks are expected to soar as exports drop given the absence of an announced quota and subsidy.

Russia's production is forecast to slide 350,000 tons to 5.8 million on lower yields compared to the unusually high yields the year before. Consumption and stocks are both forecast to decline as a result of the lower production.

Thailand's production is forecast to expand 1.2 million tons to 11.2 million as yields are expected to improve with the recovery from 2 years of drought. Exports are forecast to rise 400,000 tons to 8.4 million on increased available supplies while consumption is up slightly on growing household and industrial uses.

The Thai government is planning to deregulate the domestic sugar market in response to a petition filed by Brazil to the World Trade Organization. On October 11, 2016, the Cabinet approved a restructuring plan for the cane and sugar industry where the government will amend the current Cane and Sugar Act B.E. 2527 (1984), eliminating the sugarcane price support program, the domestic sugar price controls, and the sugar sale administration. If implemented, from MY 2017/18 onward, the government will no longer provide domestic price subsidies and direct payments to cane growers. Additionally, the current price controls on refined sugar will also be eliminated.

Selected 2016/17 Revisions from November 2016 Forecast:

- World production is flat at 170.9 million tons.
 - o Brazil is up 1.4 million tons to 39.2 million with increased cane utilized for sugar.
 - o Thailand is boosted 730,000 tons to 10.0 million on better yields.
 - o India is cut 2.0 million tons to 21.9 million on lower area and yields.
- World imports are revised 2.5 million tons higher to 54.6 million.
 - o Indonesia is up 1.3 million tons to 4.6 million on higher imports from Thailand.
 - o India is raised 900,000 tons to 2.3 million on smaller production.
 - o China is revised down 800,000 tons to 5.2 million on reduced out-of-quota imports.
- World exports are up 1.8 million tons to 57.7 million.
 - o Brazil is raised 1.0 million tons to 28.2 million on greater available supplies.
 - O Ukraine is up 340,000 tons to 480,000 tons due to higher production.
